

23 Females and 19 Males Form SWEEP Labor Force

On Monday, June 25, Project SWEEP at the Credit Valley Conservation Authority began working on its scheduled projects. The laborers are being directed by five foremen who have been trained to lead their crews safely through their assigned tasks.

The labor force this year includes 23 females and 19 males, most of whom reside within the watershed and are aware and concerned about the need for environmental enhancement. Spending hours doing general roadside clean-up makes them realize the extent to which the inconsiderate litter-bug really does hurt, and is the pet peeve of most of our students.

In addition to cleaning up after others, our crews are currently involved in other projects. Ten persons on crew one under Gary Howell are working along the creek in Erin clearing the debris and removing major obstructions to flow.

Crew two is headed by Robert Burcher and is involved in helping to clean up the Belfountain Conservation Area following completion of the new washroom and change house located there.

Third crew under the leadership of John Layelle is also doing a creek clean-up project. However John's crew is down in Port Credit doing a clean-up of Cooksville Creek from the QEW down to the lake. This area is particularly dirty and has been cleared on each of the three years of the SWEEP program.

Curt Shakespeare and crew four are busy working at the Monora Conservation Area near Orangeville clearing a rock field to prepare the area for seeding and hopefully increase the available cover for picnicking in this scenic little park.

Crew five is our specialty team this year under the direction of Karin Davies. This small crew of only six persons is developing a public education program designed to help make the general public in our watershed more aware of just how they too can contribute positively to effective environmental enhancement programs. This crew is also helping to repair and restore the old school house in East Garafraxa Township.

Entrance fee to all Conservation Areas is \$1.50 per car. Camping costs \$2.50 per unit per night. Walk-in fee at all areas is 25 cents and season's passes cost \$15. Bus entrance fee for anyone planning an outing is \$10.

Credit Valley Conservation Authority operates four conservation areas for the public: Meadowdale, Terra Cotta, Belfountain and Monora.

Meadowdale, on the Second Line West in Mississauga just north of Derry Road and Belfountain, West of Highway 10 on the Forks of Credit Road, are day-use picnic areas with barbecues, tables and modern washroom facilities for everyone. Belfountain offers lifeguards at the Credit River swimming area. There are no

lifeguards at Meadowdale. Brown and speckled trout are numerous at Belfountain.

Terra Cotta Conservation Area near Georgetown and Monora Conservation Area just north of Orangeville on Highway 10 have facilities for camping, swimming, fishing and picnics. A modern washroom is available in the picnic area at Terra Cotta and one is being constructed at Monora.

Lifeguards are on duty during regular hours at both conservation areas. The Bruce Trail winds through the Terra Cotta Area and passes near Belfountain.
