

## Upsets Order of the Day In Golden Wheels Drags

Upset proved to be the order of the day as the Molsen Golden Wheels Awards moved into its third week at Toronto International Dragway and first time winners emerged in both the Modified and Super Stock Eliminator fields.

Don Cooke was eliminated in first round Modified action when he drew the powerful A-G Opel of Jim Zakra who shut off early in an easy win at 120 mph to the trailing C-A Cuda. Neeland, at the wheel of his B-MP Camaro began a most successful night by defeating Bob Daye's E-MP Comet on a 10.79-130 pass while John Rossiter eased his Camaro into next round when the D-MP Comet of Chris Dickson lost fire at the line and was unable to restart. The Everett and Forrest D-A Camaro survived by hanging on over Brian Keith's A Dodge with a 11.54-120 split while the balance of round one winners were Gordon Strutt's D-G "Polar Express" over Norm Noddle 11.42-129 to 11.07-124 and Don Little's C-A Cuda on the bye run.

Zakra's Opel ousted the "Polar Express" in round two of eliminations by virtue of an easy 9.57-124, when Strutt en-

countered problems, shutting off at mid range. The Little C-A Cuda is still having handling problems and while Don was motoring in both lanes of the track, Rossiter tripped the Chronodak on a straight and true 11.06-116 mph. Neeland qualified for the semi finals by blowing past the Everett-Forrest Camaro when the latter snapped his drive shaft, treating the fans to a shower of sparks as he coasted to the traps. Neeland's winning effort was 10.79-110.

When the "Mods" returned for third round, Neeland drew the bye and Zakra and Rossiter squared off to decide who would face the B-MP for the final. In a super close finish the A-G Opel broke the lights first with a 9.29-137 to the Camaro's 11.17-122. In his losing effort John Rossiter collected third place money.

The "Polar Express" Gaser and Don Little's Altered paired off to decide fourth and Strutt came out on top end 11.38-114.

Don Neeland saved the best for last as he laid down a fine 10.67-131 to collect the gold and defeat the odds-on favorite Jim Zakra who trailed tell-tale smoke in an off pace 9.65-141.

In Super Stock the "old lauhar faces" of Peter Fedun,

Norm Dutton, Paul Sandon and Bill Morrison were at the draw phone for round two of eliminations along with Bob Slater, a relative newcomer to T.I.D. fans Slater eased his SS-QA 36 Chevy Wagon into the semi's with a bye run, while Fedun's SS-K Camaro had an equally easy pass when Sandon's "Gypsy Sinner" registered a red light Dutton sent the Morrison Karbell car to the trailer with an 11.70-

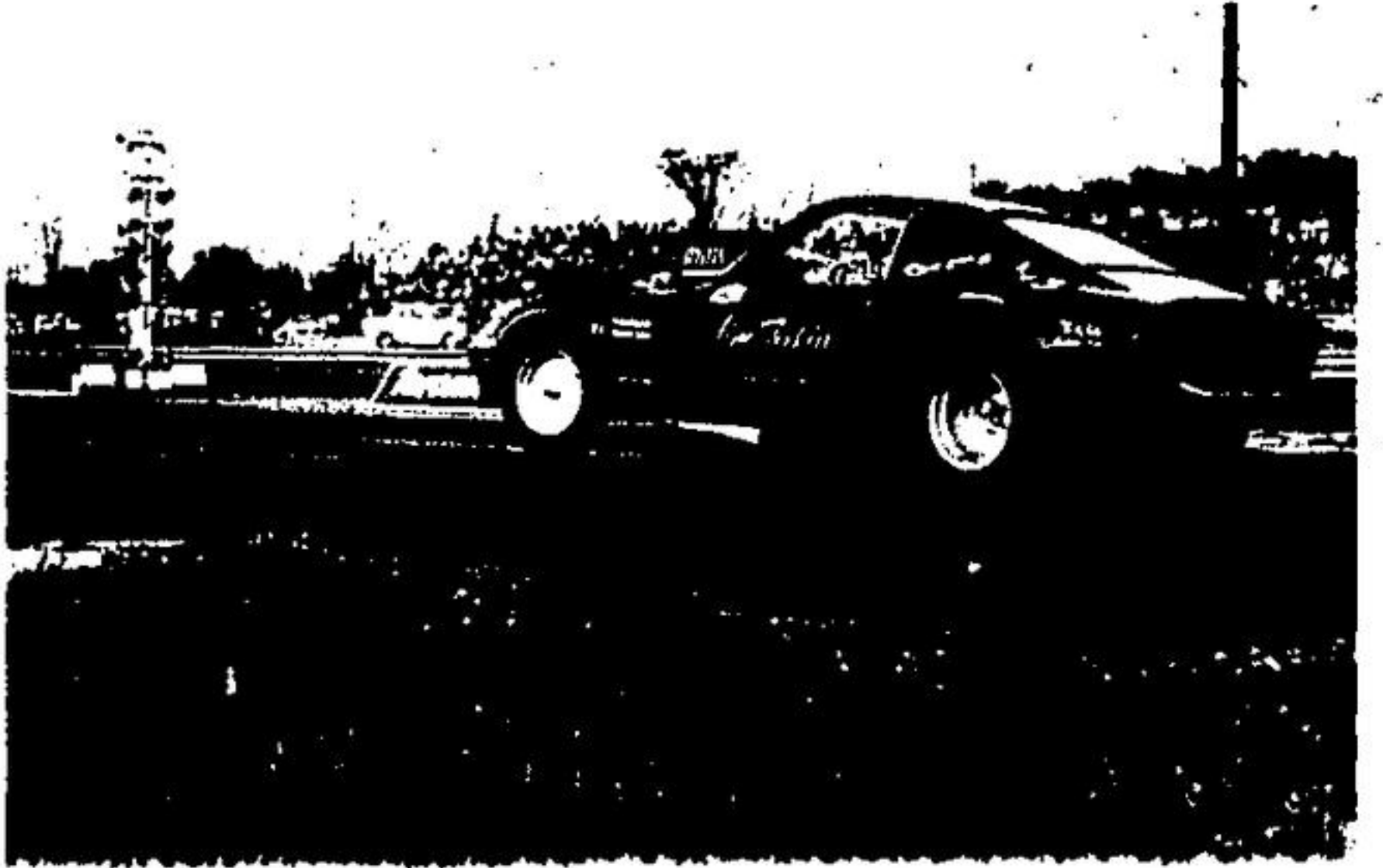
## Oaks Win Tournament

A block of 500 K.W.H. per month at a special rate of 1.05c per K.W.H. uncontrolled and 0.85c per K.W.H. controlled is available to customers using an approved electric water heater supplied through the Residential service meter after 250 K.W.H.'s per month have been billed at the foregoing rate.

**All-Electric Rate**

First 250 K.W.H. per month ..... 2.65c per K.W.H.  
Next 500 K.W.H. per month ..... 0.85c per K.W.H.  
1.25c per K.W.H. for all additional monthly consumption.  
Minimum Monthly Bill — \$3.50

**GENERAL SERVICE RATE**

**Demand Charge**

First 50 kilowatts of billing demand per month — Nil.  
Balance at \$2.40 per kilowatt of billing demand per month.

**Energy Charge**

3.1c per K.W.H. for the first 250 K.W.H. per month.  
1.82c per K.W.H. for the next 9750 K.W.H. per month.  
Balance of monthly consumption at 0.72c per K.W.H.

The General Rate is based upon service at utilization voltage; where the customer provides transformation facilities, the authorized allowance of 25c per K.W. per month for stepdown from subtransmission voltage and 15c per K.W. per month for stepdown from distribution voltage will apply.

Minimum Monthly Bill—Under 50 K.W.—\$3.50
