10 Dads Registered Pre-Natal Class

There are 10 fathers registered in pre-natal courses in Georgetown this year. Pre-natal courses are held at Centennial public school. They are six lecture sessions, which include a tour of the hospital. Of the six lectures, the fathers are requested to attend two.

Mrs. Ruth Smith, a pre-natal course instructor in Oakville attributed an increased number of courses in Oakville to reasons other than the rise in population. "I think the increase is also because more fathers are going into the delivery room with the mothers," she said.

Mrs. Fran Jamieson, pre-natal course director for north Halton, says some doctors in Georgetown do not permit fathers in the delivery room. She added that the union is not on the father to give support to his wife during the delivery. "It is enough that father give support during his wife's pregnancy and later on to the child," she said.

REQUIREMENTS
Ministry of the environment in Ontario has advised Georgetown council that Abitibi and Domtar plants have no further requirements to meet in effluent treatment, but council is not convinced, and will check its own files for possible regulations that are being overlooked.

Council in Georgetown will begin steps to arrange for interim financing for its proposed recreational facility, to the amount of \$1,200,000. Several lending institutions will be approached. Council must show financing is available to obtain provincial approvals for the project.

Let Lawn Grow To Inch and Half

Here's good news for gardeners who feel chained to their lawn mowers. Regular mowing is needed to keep a lawn in top shape, but you should allow your lawn to grow at least 1 1/2 inches high before mowing, says Burke McNeill, horticultural specialist, Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food. Close mowing reduces

resistance to drought, stimulates weed growth, and produces thin, patchy turf. During the normally hot, dry months of July and August, it is particularly important not to crop lawns too closely. To keep lawns looking good at this time of year, it's important to give them a thorough soaking once a week. Apply enough water to moisten the soil to a depth of several inches. Early morning or evening are the best times to water.
