

## Zakia And Fedun Increase International Dragway Lead

With the grand nationals attracting many track regulars there were sparse fields in the top money brackets at Toronto International Dragway and as a result Jim Zakia, the current points leader, had little trouble successfully handling competition in the Modified Eliminator class.

Don Clunke was the first one to fall as Zakia's A-G Opel blasted out a near record 9.26-138 to stop a game 10.12 e.t. on the C-A Cuda. The Everett-Forrest's D-A Camaro made no mistake as it sent Glenn Forrest's E-MP 57 Chevy to the trailer with an 11.81-110 mph effort, while in other first round action the Scoborne and Howe D-A Maverick advanced easily when Warren and Yarlett's C-G Nova tripped a red light. Bob Elliott closed out round one as he eased the Ball Auction Camaro through on the bye run.

With the field reduced to four, Jim Zakia wasted no time in qualifying for his familiar role in the final when he blew by the Forrest-Everett Camaro with a 9.78 top end charge over the D-A 12.37-167 split. The Ball Auction car completed the final pairing as Elliott drove the C-G Camaro to a fine 10.86-125 in defeating Scoborne's D-A, which tripped the lights with an 11.60-114.

In its losing effort the Galt based Wagon encountered mechanical problems and was unable to return, allowing Haber's SS Chevelle to solo for third place money. For the gold Fedun's SS-1A got the slight handicap start over Freeman's SS-1A and never looked back as he won going away with 11.76-115 to the Mustang's 12.50-113.

In stock eliminator action, Gary Miller wheeled his E-S Dodge Duster around a large field and in the final came up with a 14.37-99 mph effort to defeat runner-up Robert Bonneau's G-SA Camaro for top purse.

As well as Fedun, first round winners were Bob Schilling driving Peter Scott's SS-0A Chevy Wagon, Dave Freeman's SS-1A Mustang and Nemur Haber's SS-1A Entec Chevle.

Fedun commented that the automatic route he selected in his new car should prove more consistent and reliable and one would have to agree as he laid down an 11.78-115 for the second time as he dumped Haber's Chevle in round two.

Freeman's Mustang earned a berth in the final when he eclipsed the handicap and flew by Scott's SS-0A at the traps, recording 12.58-114.

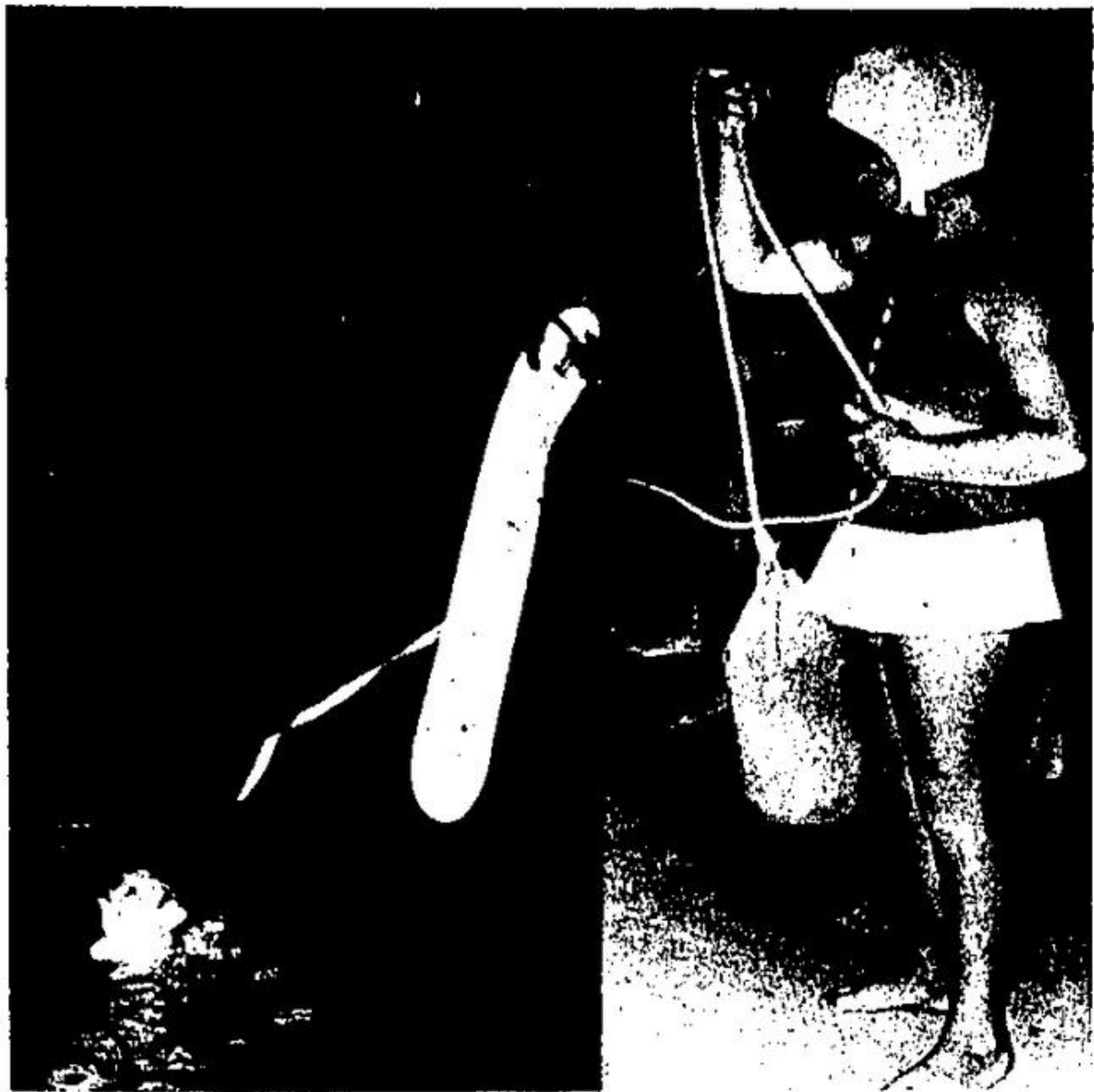

## Red Cross Swim Tips

A safety message from the Georgetown and District branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society advises:

Swim in well-supervised areas.

Always swim with a buddy.

Swim and wade only in known water.

Swim when rested.

Drinking and swimming do not go together.

Cool off before swimming.

For safety and enjoyment swim in water between 68-75 degrees F.

Swimming after dark is very dangerous.

Non Swimmers vacuuming pools should wear life-jackets, or be accompanied by swimmers, with reaching poles or ring buoys available.

Keep reaching aids handy near all potential dangerous water areas.

Dive only into deep water which has been marked.

Swim parallel to the shore if swimming a long distance.

Inner tubes and air mattresses are dangerous.

Plastic wading pools and buoys can be deathtraps for children. Supervise them.

Remember, a person can drown in 2" of water.

Small children in, on and around water (including the family pool) should wear government approved lifejackets.

Avoid horseplay both in the water and in a boat. Playfulness may cost a life.

Non-swimmers must wear lifejackets when in a boat.

A boat must contain a lifejacket for everyone.

Water skiers must always wear lifejackets.

If your boat or canoe capsizes, hang on!

An overloaded boat is like a fishhook with a weight, it sinks!

Boating and drinking don't mix.

Panic causes many drownings. Try to remain calm.

Learn rescue breathing (mouth to mouth artificial respiration).

Lifeguards are responsible for your safety-obey them. Lifeguards are not babysitters.
