

## New Hockey Loop For Older Teens

Seventeen and 18 year olds will have an organized league in which to play hockey this year.

Don Johnston, president of the Georgetown and District Minor Hockey Association, said in a press release this week that ice time had been arranged at the Memorial Arena Saturday nights from 10.15 during the season.

Registration times have been scheduled for the mornings of Sept. 8 and 15 and the evening of Sept. 12. Coaches and managers are currently being sought.
