North Halton voters will elect a municipality mayor, two area councillors and one regional councillor per ward, and one board of education trustee for-Actum and Esquesing and another for Georgetown. NAME TOO

Regional councillors will also sit on the area council, while the mayor will also serve on regional council.

Voters will also choose the name for their new municipality in the election. A committee composed representatives of each of the constituent municipalities is now sifting its way through names suggested by area residents.

According to Mr. Pritchard, the committee hopes to forward two names for the bullot for approval to minister of and tergovernmental affairs and treasurer John White next week.


