

20,500 Eligible To Vote In North Halton Election

Preliminary voters lists posted Monday list 20,560 North Halton residents as eligible to vote in the Oct. 1-3 North Halton regional government elections, clerk and revising officer Doug Pritchard said Monday.

The list, copies of which are on display at the three constituent municipalities' offices, names 3,654 eligible voters in Acton, 6,275 in Esqueping Township, 5,519 in north Georgetown, and 5,112 in south Georgetown.

The three municipalities will be merged to form the new municipality of North Halton when regional government takes over Jan. 1, 1974. The two smaller municipalities each constitute one ward, with Georgetown being split into two relatively equal wards. Previously, Georgetown had three wards.

North Halton voters will elect a municipality mayor, two area councillors and one regional councillor per ward, and one board of education trustee for Acton and Esqueping and another for Georgetown.

Regional councillors will also sit on the area council, while the mayor will also serve on regional council.

Voters will also choose the name for their new municipality in the election. A committee composed of representatives of each of the constituent municipalities is now sifting its way through names suggested by area residents.

According to Mr. Pritchard, the committee hopes to forward two names for the ballot for approval to minister of economics and intergovernmental affairs and treasurer John White next week.

Bill 151, the act creating the new region of North Halton, says voters are to be offered no more than three names from which to choose.

Month-Old Pups Left On 4th Line

Two puppies, not more than four weeks old, were found asleep on the Fourth Line of Esqueping near 17 Sideroad Tuesday morning by Bonnie Campbell, a Fourth Line resident.

Miss Campbell, who found the abandoned puppies at 6.30 a.m. on her way to work, said they are part hound. She took them into her farm home and fed them.

"They are so small I picked both up in one hand," said Miss Campbell. She said milk had to be warmed before the puppies would drink.

She was outraged at the idea anyone would abandon such small, helpless animals. "By living on a farm we were brought up to feel we either looked after animals properly or destroyed them humanely," Miss Campbell stated they would keep the pups if another home could not be found.

Two weeks ago a similar incident occurred on the Sixth Line of Esqueping where three puppies were abandoned. In that case, homes were eventually found for all of them.
