Potential \$500 Fine For Cutting Trees Rebates On Way

It is now an offence in Halton County to cut down or destroy some trees that are less than full grown. The offence carries a potential fine of \$500. The measure was approved by county council earlier this week and it provides for the appointment of three officers to enforce the bylaw. The ruling does not apply to landowners who have been in possession of their property for two years or more. It is designed instead to curb the wholesale slaughter of growing forests by land speculators and to limit commercial lumbering operations. Private landowners are free to cut trees for their own use but not for commercial sale. **UNDER 18 INCHES** The bylaw, however, doesn't apply to trees that are cut to be sold as Christmas trees, trees that are diseased or damaged, or that are cut to improve forest stands or to clear areas for fireguards, skid ways, or logging trails. A list of the varieties of protected trees include types of ash, oak, pine, maple, and black cherry, trees that have not reached 18 inches in diameter or 56 inches in circumference. White birch, white cedar, white spruce, hemlock and poplar trees that are less than eight inches in diameter and 25 inches in circumference may not be cut. The measurements include the bark of the tree and should be taken 18 inches above the base. The Grand and General Council is the governing body of San Marino.

Take notice that Nominations on the proper form will be received by the undersigned at the Georgetown Municipal Building, 36 Main Street North, for the following Elected Offices for a three year term, 1974, 1975 and 1976:

- MUNICIPAL COUNCIL**
- A Mayor—to be elected at large and serve as a member on both the Regional and Town Councils.
 - Four Regional-Area Councillors—to serve as a member on both the Regional and Town Councils. One Regional-Area Councillor to be elected from each of the four Wards.
 - Eight Area Councillors—to serve as a member on the Town Council only. Two Area Councillors to be elected from each of the Four Wards.
- DIVISIONAL BOARD OF EDUCATION**
- Two Public School Trustees—to serve as a member on the public school board. One Trustee to be elected from the area comprising Wards One and Two and One Trustee to be elected from the area comprising Wards Three and Four.
- SEPARATE SCHOOL BOARD**
- One Separate School Trustee—to be elected at large and serve as a member on the Separate School Board.
- The period during which nominations for the above offices will be received is as follows: 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on Thursday, September 6, 1973; Friday, September 7, 1973 and Monday, September 10, 1973. Nominations cannot be made after 5.00 p.m. on Monday, September 10, 1973. The Municipal Building is closed on Saturday, September 8th and Sunday, September 9th, 1973.

It should be noted that the nomination of candidates (one to be elected) to serve on the Divisional Board of Education as a Representative of Separate School Supporters in the North Halton, Central Halton and Oakville areas, will be received by the Returning Officer of the Town of Oakville at the Town of Oakville Municipal Building, 1225 Trafalgar Road, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Thursday, September 6th and Friday, September 7th, 1973 and between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Monday, September 10th, 1973.

The name, occupation, address and office nominated for each candidate will be posted in the Council Chambers at the Town of Georgetown Municipal Building as nominations are received and certified. The onus of filing a bona fide nomination paper is on the candidate.

This nomination procedure has been made mandatory by the Provincial Government pursuant to an Act Respecting Municipal Elections and, accordingly there will be no nomination meeting as convened in the past.
