NEW COUNCIL PAY MAY BE \$5,000
Members of the new Halton regional council will likely be paid between \$4,000 and \$5,000 a year for their first three-year term Halton Region chairman Allan Masson said last week.
Addressing Nassagaweya council, Mr. Masson said he guessed municipal politicians would earn from \$8,000 to \$10,000 each year if they serve on both local and regional councils.
He indicated that some people were talking in the range of \$17,000 to \$18,000 per year for the two jobs. He said he felt that was too much.
The chairman's job pays \$27,000 plus expenses.
