Family Conducts Hunt For Run-Away Felines

Editor's Note: Since this story was written, one of the missing cats, the little one, has been located, dead, a victim of a vehicle on Highway 7 west. The second cat has been seen several times and the family hopes someone will recognize it and take it in and contact them.

Dexter and Little Pussy have been missing for more than a month now. The family misses them, and there is a reward of \$100 outstanding for their return. Dexter and Little Pussy are a pair of cats.

They belong to the Ron Martin family of Mississauga, and they've been missing since about the end of July when they went absent without leave from a Georgetown area kennel.

Mr. Martin has posted the reward for their return, at \$50 per cat.

Neither one is as valuable as the reward would seem to indicate, but Mr. Martin said the pair is a valued member of the family. He has had the cats since he brought them back from California as kittens, three years ago.

The two cats, brother and sister, are part Siamese.

Dexter is the big one, and weighed 13 to 15 pounds when he went into boarding while

the Martin family was away for the summer. He's gray in color, with a white stomach, and had on a blue collar at the time of his disappearance. He has big wide eyes.

Little Pussy is much smaller in size, and is black with a white stomach. She was pregnant when she departed the kennel.

Mr. Martin said Dexter will answer to his name.

He suspects the cats are still in the Georgetown area, possibly on a farm somewhere. He said he has had a report of a sighting of a large gray cat, and it could have been Dexter.

Mr. Martin, a Sheridan College instructor at the Oakville campus, said he has boarded the cats before, for a short time only. In the past, though, he usually left the cats with a trusted student when the family was away.

"Somehow, we'd like to get the cats back," he said. "And the reward still stands." The cats are missed by son Jon, 10.

The kennel operator has conducted his own search for the missing cats, and so has the Martin family.

Anyone who has a clue about the cats and their location, should contact Mr. Martin at the college.
