Georgetown demolition derby driver Brian Hill came through with his biggest victory in 11 years, Saturday, capturing a trophy and \$500 pay cheque in the Pinecrest Speedway Wreck-A-Rama.

"I've hung onto the same car for as many as seven races, but it looked more like a little foreign import by the time I was finished," said Hill who has never been hurt in competition.

He intends to go after the \$500 first place money up for grabs

Sept. 14 at Speedway Park in Stoney Creek, \$1,500 at the world championship demolition at Ipp Speedway, Long Island, New York, and \$500 at Pinecrest Speedway on Highway 7, Oct. 7.

The 96 cars that entered the Wreck-A-Rama were all out of commission in less than half an hour.
