### How Marvelous God's Creation

One evening during our holidays my wife and I went for a walk along the railroad tracks. My wife is fascinated by the variety and beauty of weeds and wildflowers. This evening, however, we were on a special assignment. Our goal was to capture every caterpillar which we spied on a milkweed plant. We found three of these beautiful creatures and brought them home, along with several leaves. After placing two of the caterpillars on leaves in our children's bug-keeper we began our observation. It was quite fascinating to see them literally devour these leaves. What an appetite! The next day we gave each of them a fresh leaf, which we had kept in water. Again their strong jaws went to work.

The third day something new took place. One of the caterpillars went to the top of the container and began to spin a strong "button" with its spinneret. After it was securely fastened and it took some time the caterpillar gripped it with the hooks on its rear legs, and hung there upside down.

The next stage was more fascinating still. The caterpillar began to wriggle and gather itself up into a compact ball. The next thing we noticed was a very small deposit of skin at the bottom of the jar. Any book on caterpillars or butterflies will give you a detailed, scientific explanation of this most delicate and amazing process. The pupa, I have since learned, had already been formed inside the caterpillar's skin. Now bare, and securely fastened to the button, the pupa formed a hard, outer shell which we know as the chrysalis. Later we noticed tiny, gold-colored dots, formed in a circle, on the outside. So even this dark-colored chrysalis was beautiful to behold.

**FINAL STAGE OF TRANSFORMATION**

Nearly two weeks later came the final stage of metamorphosis or transformation. At the bottom of the chrysalis there appeared a tiny hole. Gradually, bit by bit, the adult monarch butterfly began to appear. We watched it push itself out, still hanging from the shell. By tightening its muscles, I read, the butterfly pumps air and blood through its body and wings. As it fell to the bottom of the jar, we watched this take place. We saw the body gradually extend itself until it was long and slim. Then we watched the wings take shape. It looked at first as if they were crushed and broken, but gradually they began to expand and flatten out. And there, before our eyes, appeared a creature of exquisite beauty. The life cycle of the monarch butterfly had just been completed.

For some of you this is nothing new. You are lovers of nature, and have probably watched this process of metamorphosis, or transformation, in many insects. For me it was quite new. I had never witnessed the metamorphosis of a monarch butterfly. I just can't get over what I saw: the fantastic changes which took place before my very eyes from egg, to larva, to pupa and chrysalis, to the adult butterfly!

"How marvelous, beyond human expression, are the creations of God," I said to myself then, as I do now. I will never be able to understand the thought processes and reasoning of those who declare that wonders, such as I have described above, just evolved on their own. But even more amazing is the miracle of spiritual conversion, when the spirit of God invades the life of a believer and the process of transformation into the likeness of Christ begins to take place.
