

This Regional Business It's Not Really Confusing

Elections for the four new regional municipalities of Durham, Peel, Halton and Hamilton-Wentworth and the new Town of Wasaga Beach will be held on Monday, Oct. 1, taking the place of municipal elections usually held in December. Voting hours are 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. Instead of nomination meetings to select candidates for office, a new procedure has been introduced into Ontario under the Municipal Elections Act 1972. Similar to provincial and federal election procedures, it requires the

filling and federal election procedures, it requires the filling of nomination papers by a candidate with the local returning officer—usually the municipal clerk.

There will be a referendum to select a name for the Regional Municipality of Durham and the area municipalities of Alton (in Peel), Flamborough (in Hamilton-Wentworth) and Central and North Halton (in Halton).

THE TWO-TIER SYSTEM
Commencing Jan. 1, 1974, the interests of residents in the new regional governments will be looked after through a two-tier system which divides services according to regional and local needs.

Regional Council is mainly responsible for over-all planning, water supply and distribution, sewage collection and treatment, police, main roads, traffic lights and controls, garbage disposal, health and welfare, regional library system, borrowing for capital expenditures and conservation. Local Councils will be mainly responsible for local planning, streets and sidewalks, local water and sewers, garbage collection, fire protection, bus service, parks and recreation, libraries, building inspection and tax collection.

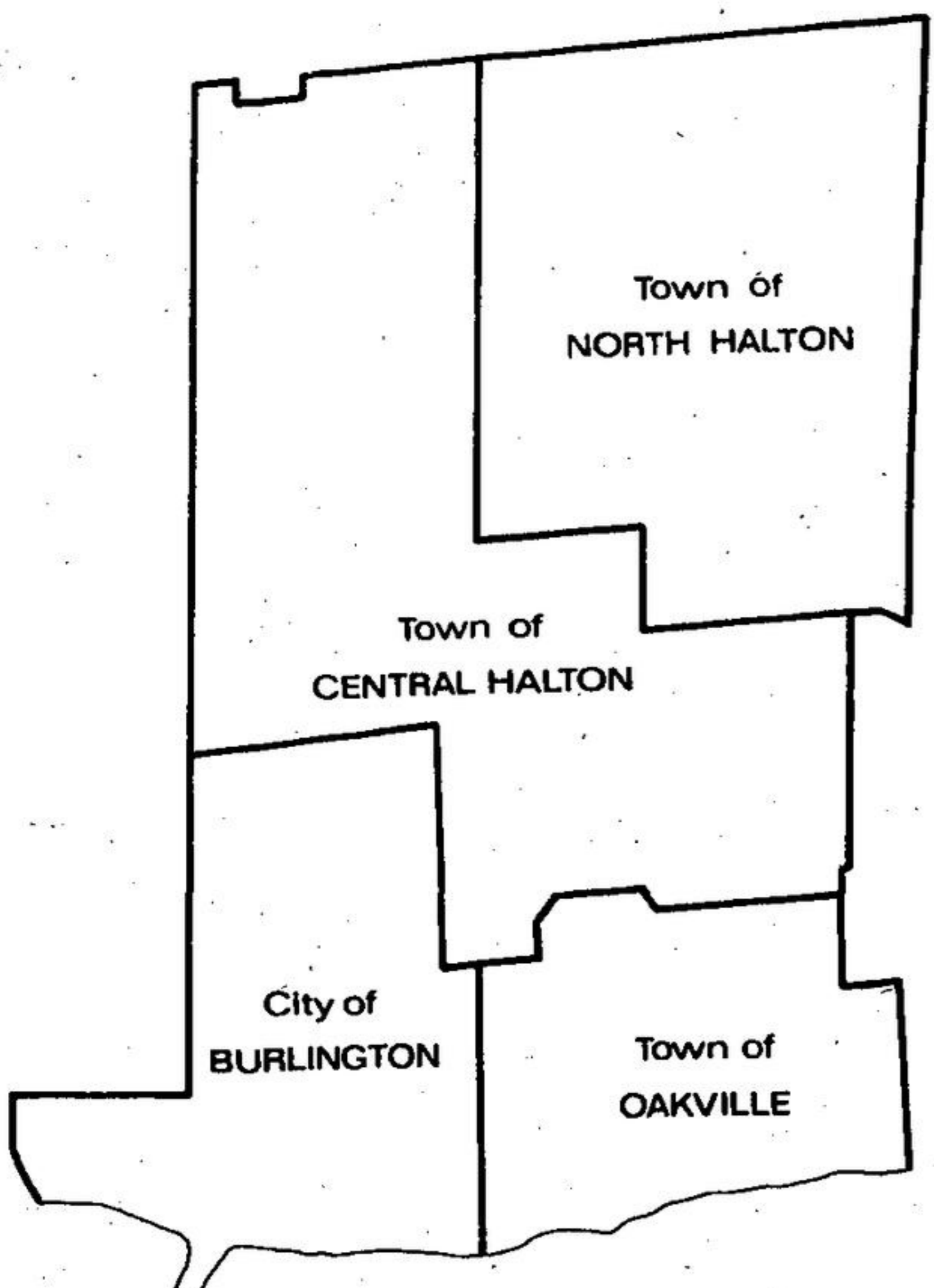
third; Barry Reid, Georgetown, fourth; and Randy Peddie, Georgetown, fifth.
