

A Road is a Road Unless It's Private

When is a road not a road? When it's on private property. Then it's a lane. At least that's the determination. Esqueing council has been using when faced with the query.

Tuesday night, they were forced into some fancy footwork when they learned a building permit has been issued in error for construction of a house in Terra Cotta with its frontage on a private road.

The discovery came after they already juggled two similar hot potatoes earlier in the same meeting.

A letter from solicitors acting for E. Steiner, Lot 5, Con. 4, Esqueing, asked that they be permitted to present their case for approval for his application to build on a private road. And a delegation for which Lou Hogue and Nick Hunsley were spokesmen, urged some assistance from the township in putting a private road off 22 Sideroad, east of Highway 7, into shape.

The delegation was told that their request was out of the question, but before they left council agreed to a suggestion by Reeve Tom Hill that the council members at least visit the road and look at its condition.

During a review of September building permits, later in the meeting, council found an entry for D. L. Jones of Terra Cotta who had been granted a permit to construct a house and garage on a private road there. "We must have bigger mouths than feet, since we seem to keep putting our feet in our mouths," commented deputy reeve Len Cox, as council agreed to allow the Jones job to proceed.

Toward the end of the

meeting, a motion to comply with the Steiner request for a permit was put forward and then withdrawn without discussion.

No GO Noise During Night

Georgetown residents will escape the noise of the GO Train diesel units during the night because the crews and power units will return to the Mimico yards at night says R.B. McEwan, operations manager of GO transit.

Mr. McEwan told the Toronto bureau of the Georgetown Herald the original plan was for the construction of a terminal building at Georgetown, however, this plan has been abandoned in favor of returning the units to the Willowbrook yards on the Toronto Lakeshore route for servicing.

He said the cars and two units will remain in Georgetown overnight. These units will use electricity for auxiliary heating and lighting and there will be no noise.

Car cleaning and general maintenance will be done at the Georgetown site while major overhauls and inspections will take place at the Mimico yards, he said.

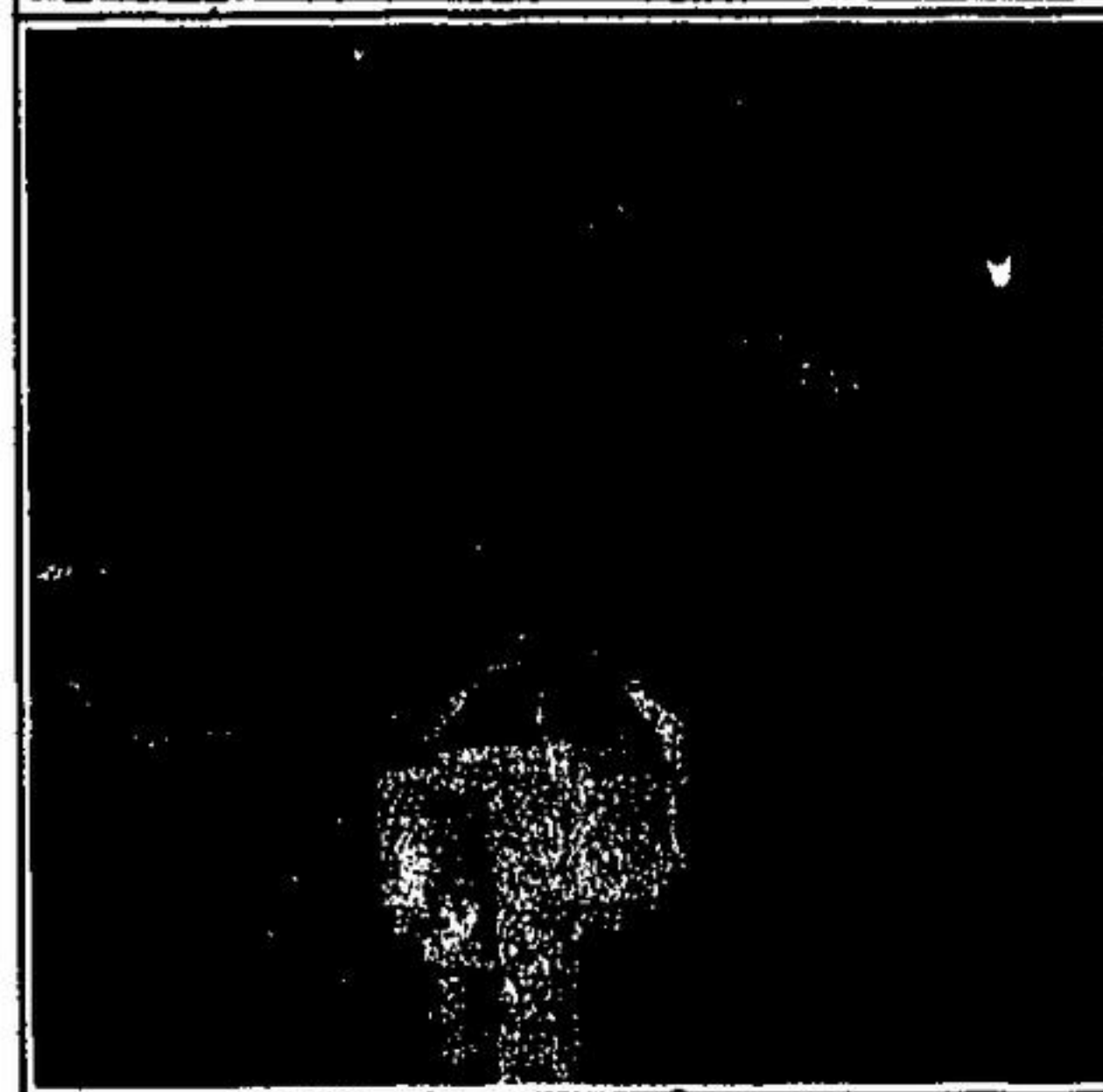
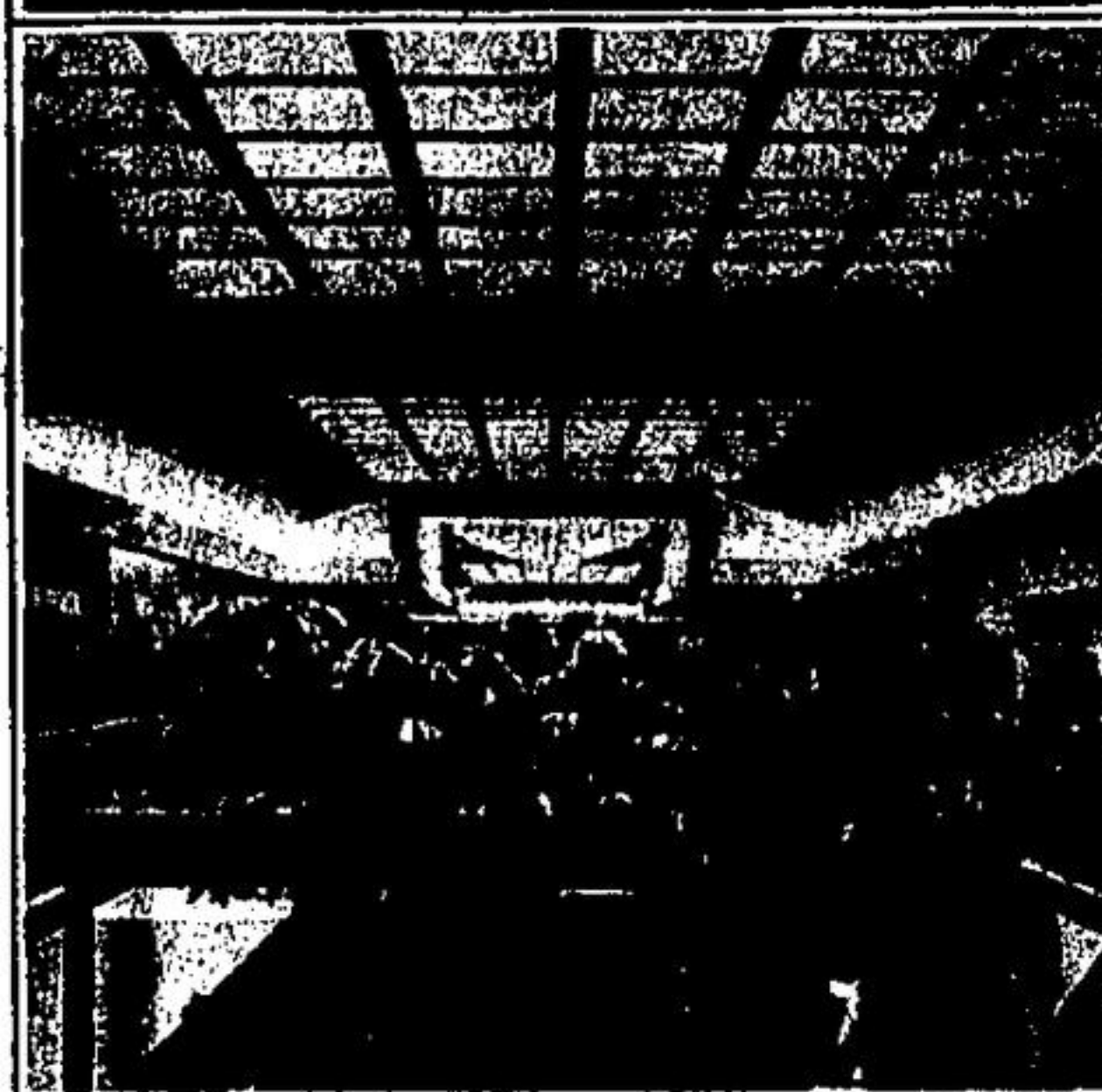

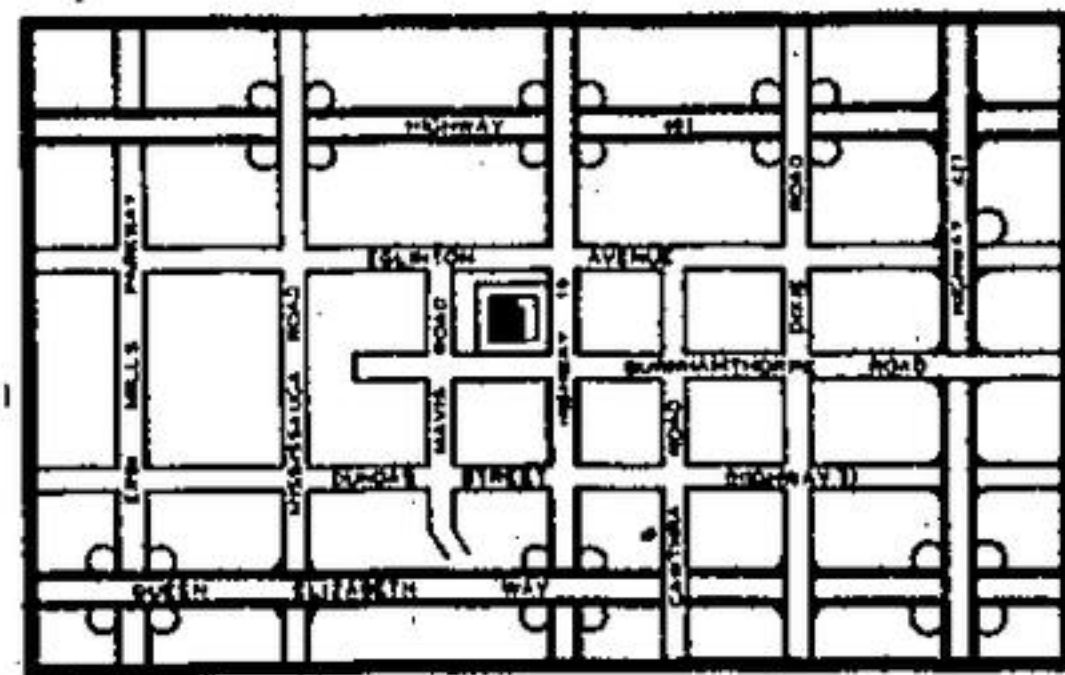
