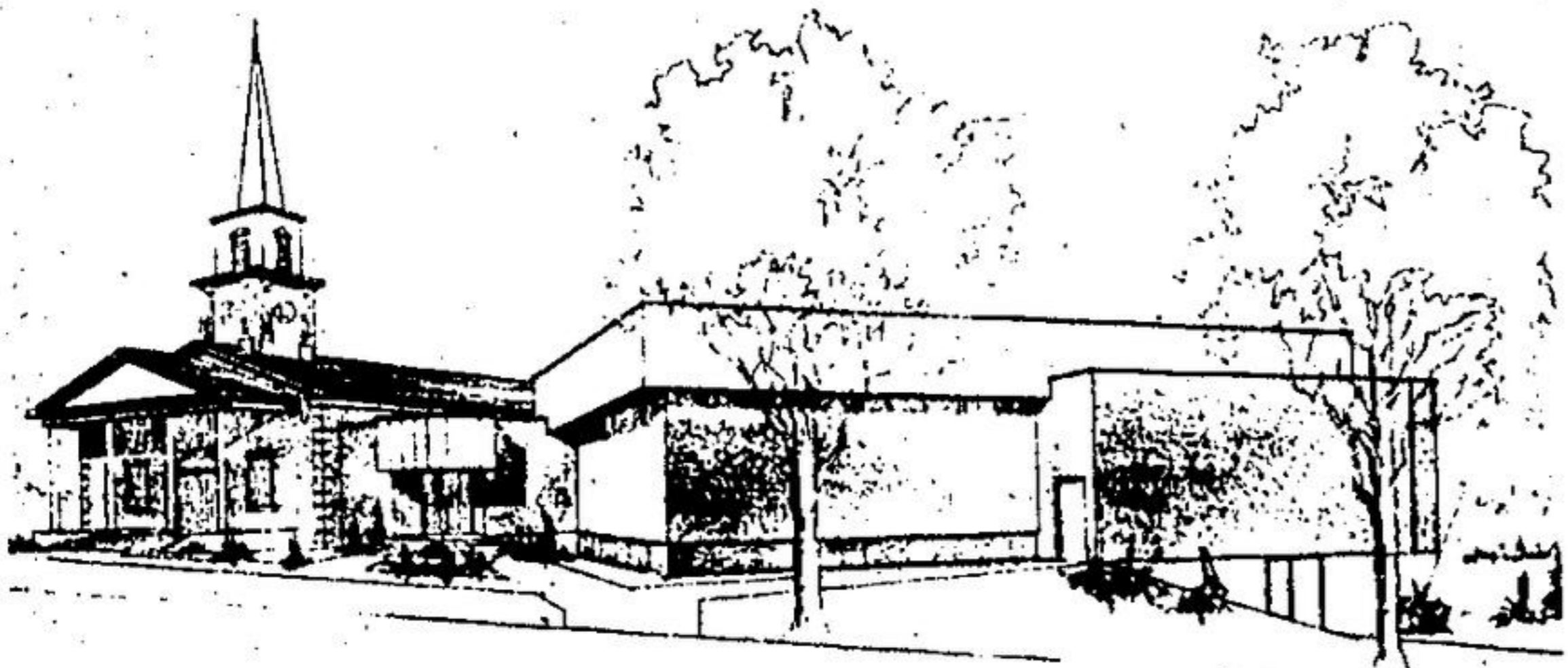
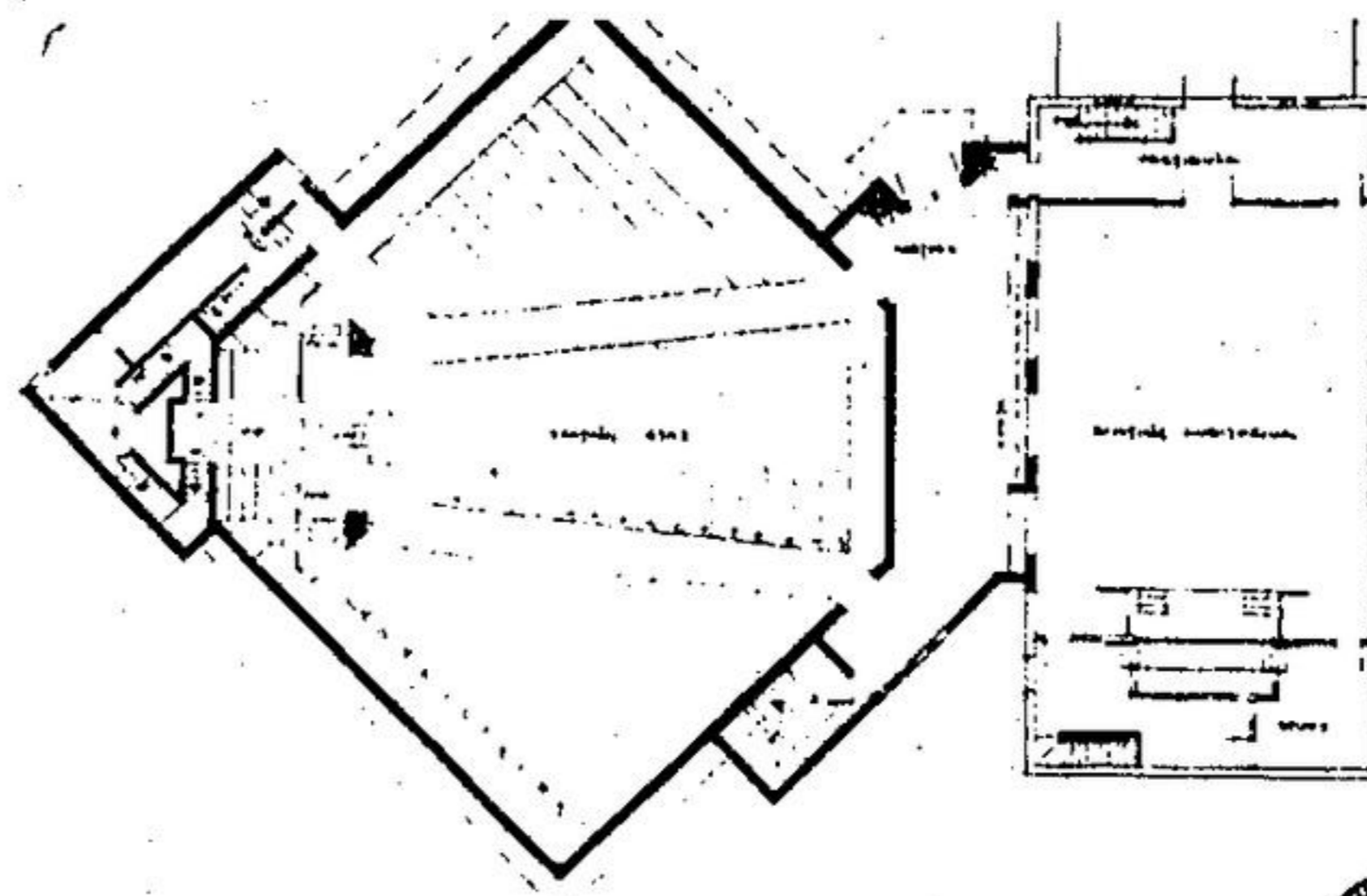


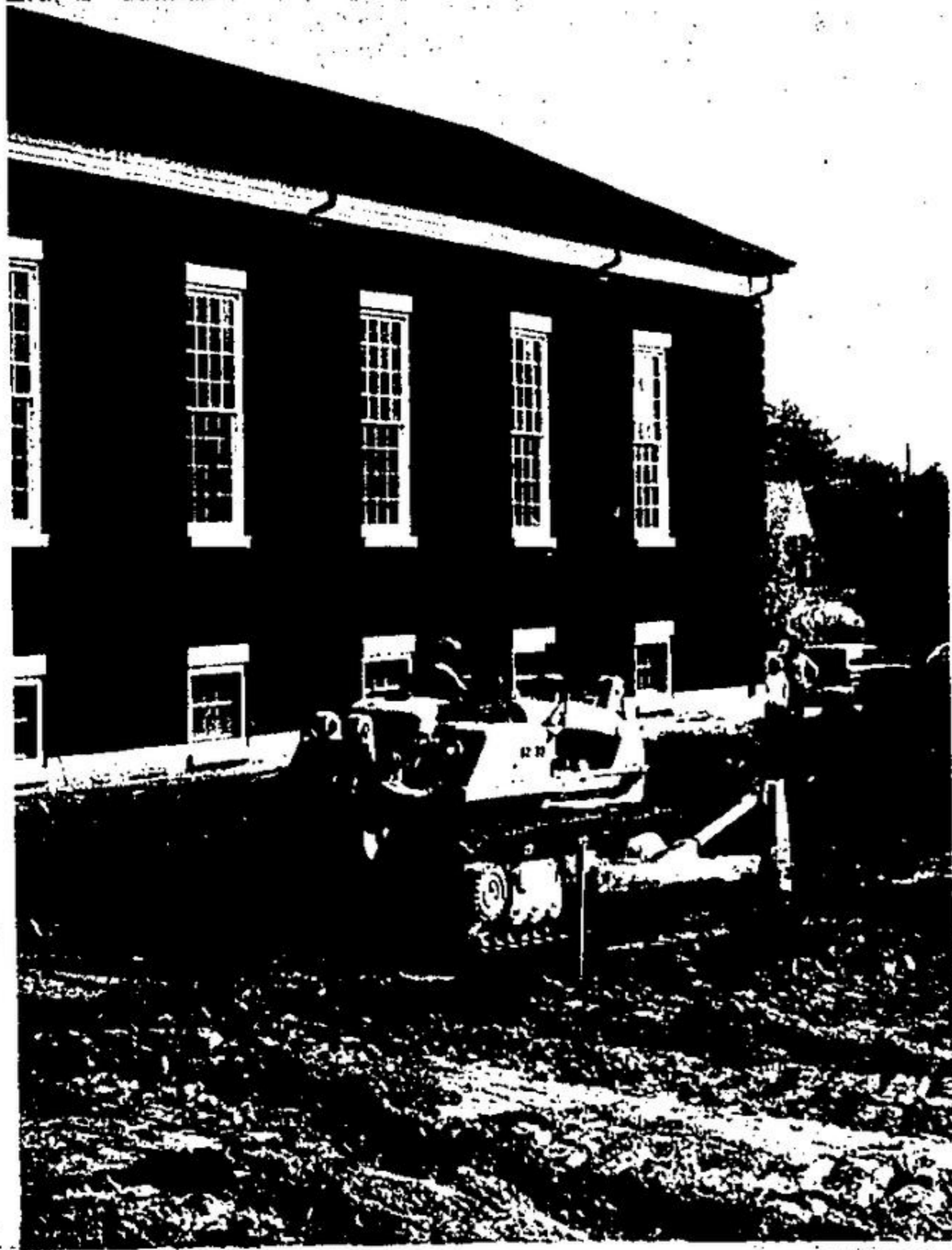
MAPLE AVENUE BAPTIST CHURCH EXPANSION



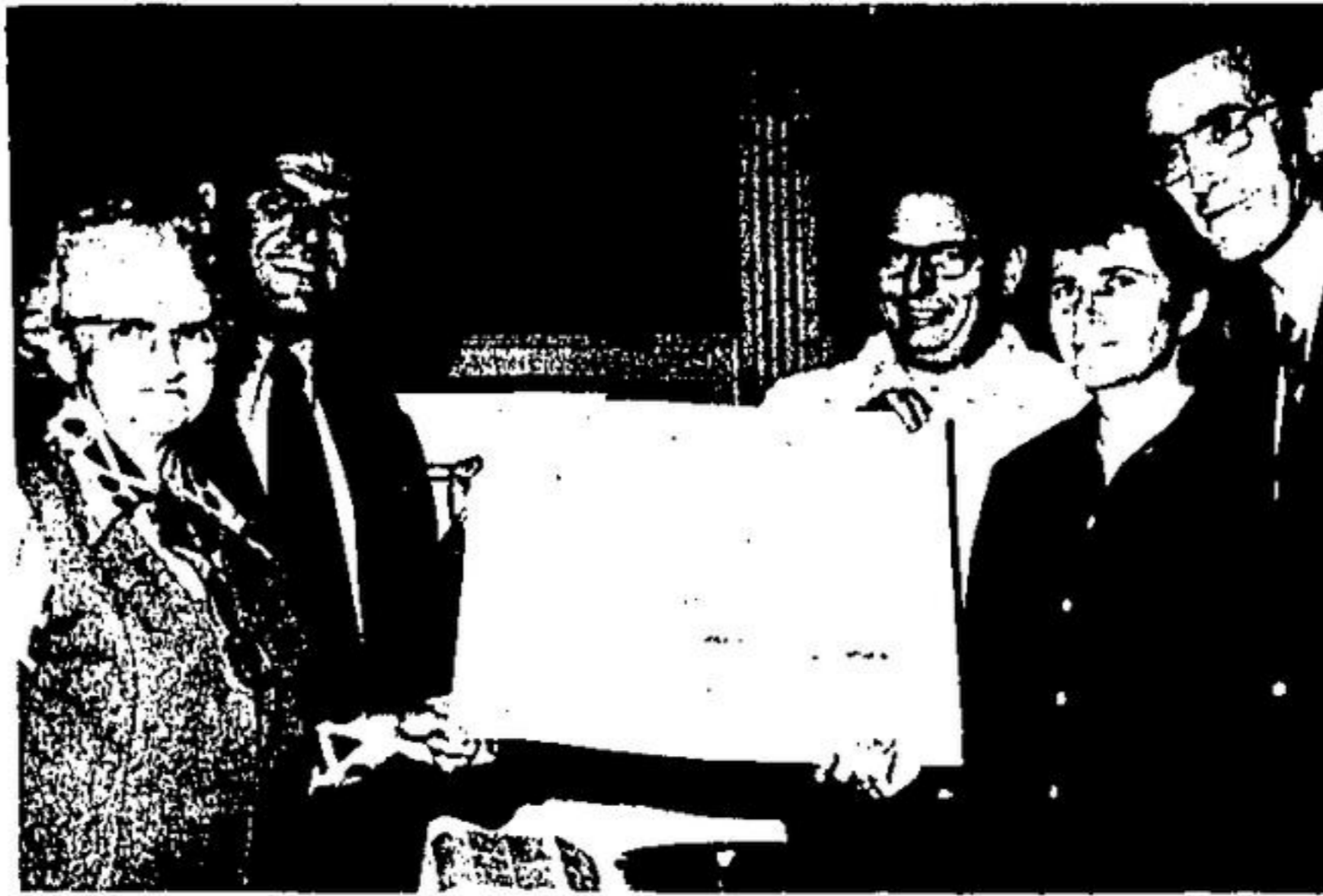
FRONTAL VIEW DRAWING OF MAPLE AVENUE CHURCH ADDITION (Home Town Studios)
