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Sites Chosen For Landfill

A solid waste management study, authorized by the county has pinpointed two potential landfill sites, scarcely a mile north of Acton.

It has also listed the Indusmin Quarry, already the source of a dumping furor earlier this year, as another potential single disposal site for all the garbage to be collected in Halton County for as many as 20 years.
