## Halton Hills Happenings

### Grant Sought

An Esqueing Township man has applied for a \$75,000 Local Initiatives program grant to improve a private lane, and he has received the approval of the township council.

The lane links Nick Hunsley's home with 22 Sideroad. He has applied before council in the past, seeking municipal assistance to have the lane repaired.

Reeve Tom Hill said it appeared the grant would be approved. He said he had consulted with Halton MP Terry O'Connor who said the grant was the only one applied for in Halton County.

The grant would be spent on township laneways to bring them up to standard so they could be taken over by the municipality. As well, the laneway used by Mr. Hunsley and his neighbors would receive as much as 200 tons of gravel provided and transported by the township. Gravel would not be laid on other lanes.

Deputy Reeve Len Cox and Coun. Richard Howitt protested, arguing for equal treatment for all lanes.

### Pool Plans

Halton County Board of Education and the Town of Acton have reached formal agreement to build a swimming pool.

The pool will be built at Acton District High School. Under the terms of the agreement, the town assumes the responsibility for building the pool and the board will operate and maintain it.

During the school hours, the board has use of the pool. During hours spelled out in the agreement, the town will have use of the pool for public swimming and recreation.

Georgetown recently undertook a similar agreement with the school board, and Milton, Oakville and Burlington have also been involved also.

### Super Chief

Burlington Police Chief Ken Skerrett will become super chief of the new regional municipality of Halton.

Sources within the provincial government said the new regional chief will be hired formally by the regional council when it takes office in January.

The job reportedly was a tossup between Chief Skerrett and Oakville Police Chief F. W. Oliver, the source said, but some trouble within the Oakville department was given as the reason for going with the Burlington chief.

Headquarters for the regional department will be located in Oakville at the new police building. Substations will be located in key communities within the regional Halton unit.

Georgetown is one of these. Chief Oliver will be offered a senior position with the regional department.

A new hotel will be erected to replace the Milton Inn, destroyed last week by fire.

Ted Jaskula, owner of the Inn, was in hospital recuperating from a slight injury, when word of the fire reached him. He was able to view the scene of the fire briefly.

He said he plans to demolish the remains of the structure and to build again, possibly using some of the original bricks for the front of the new building.

The new structure will not be the same size. Instead, a new hotel with about 20 rooms is forecast by Mr. Jaskula. He expects building to start shortly.

At the time of the fire, there were 27 persons in residence at the Milton Inn.

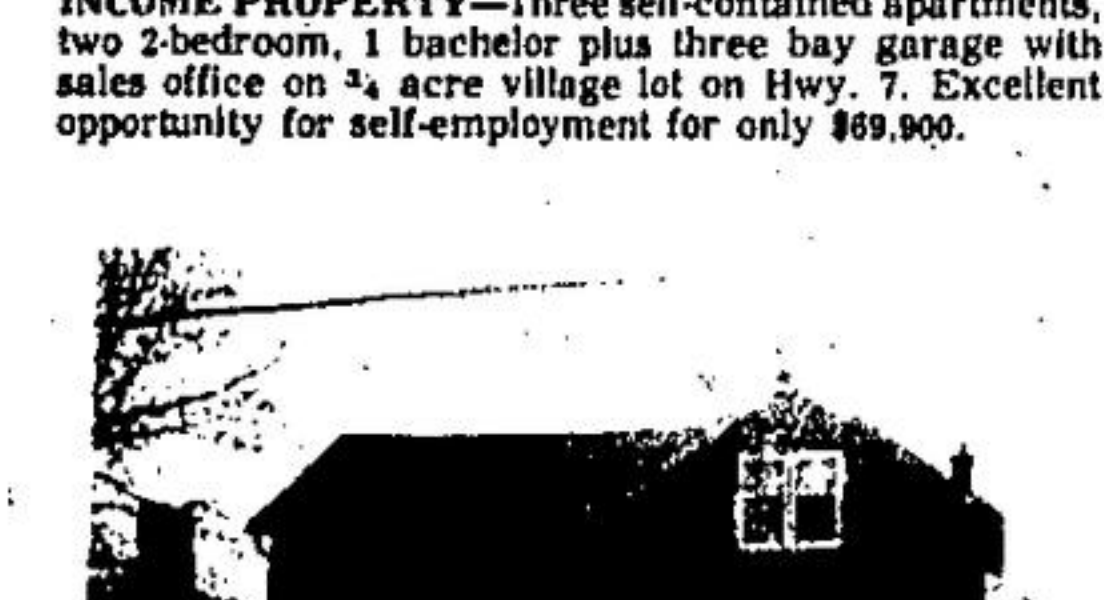

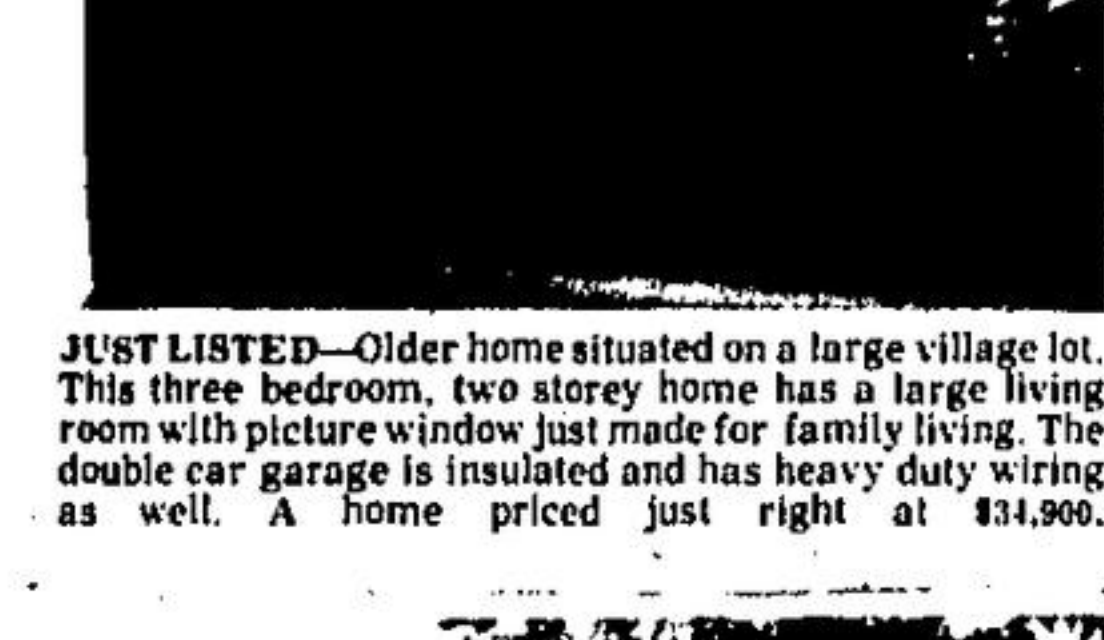

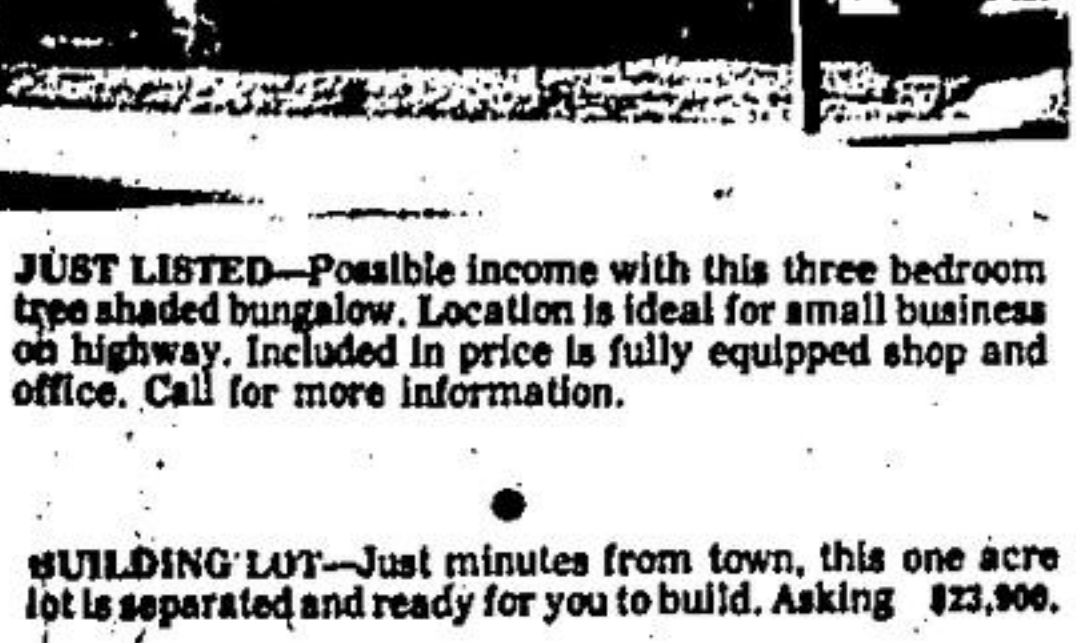
