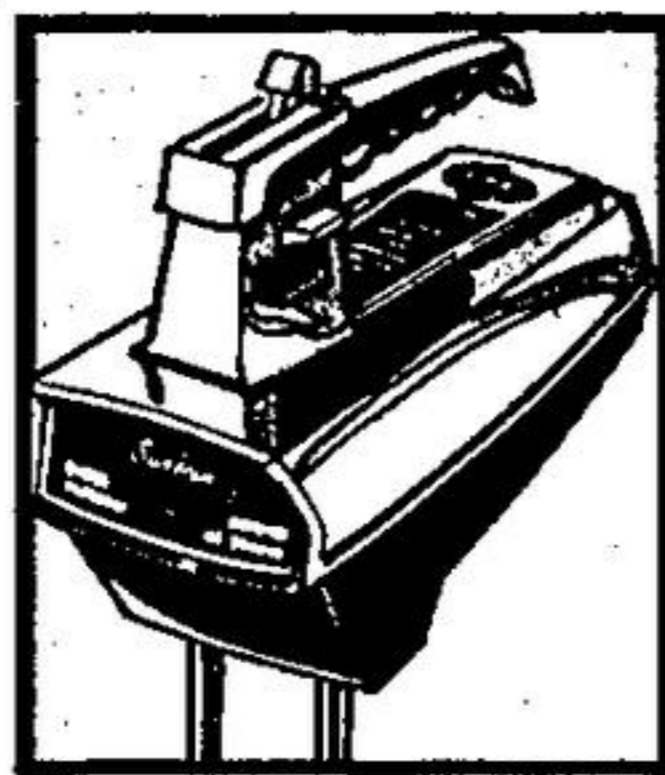
Earl and Judy Burt attended the wedding of a cousin Saturday, Oct. 20 in Michigan and grandparents looked after the children. A treat for all concerned.

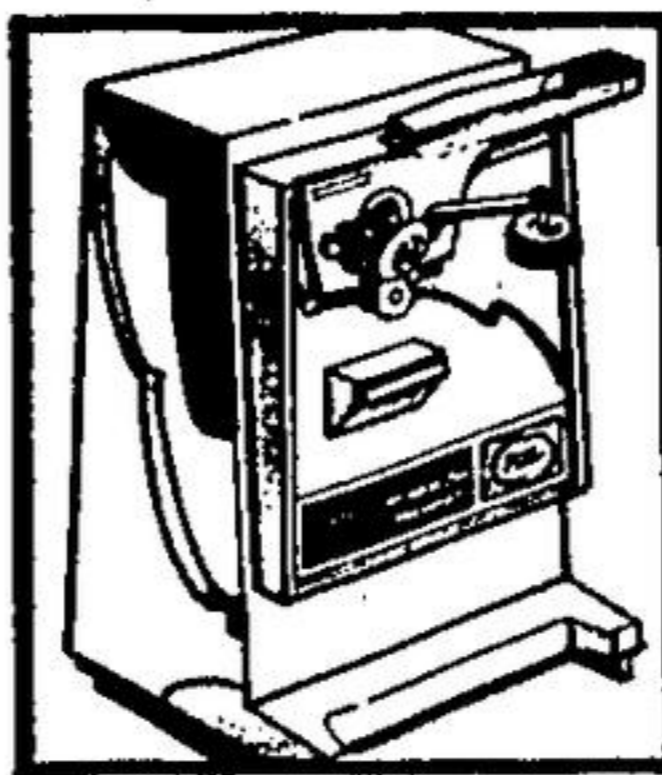

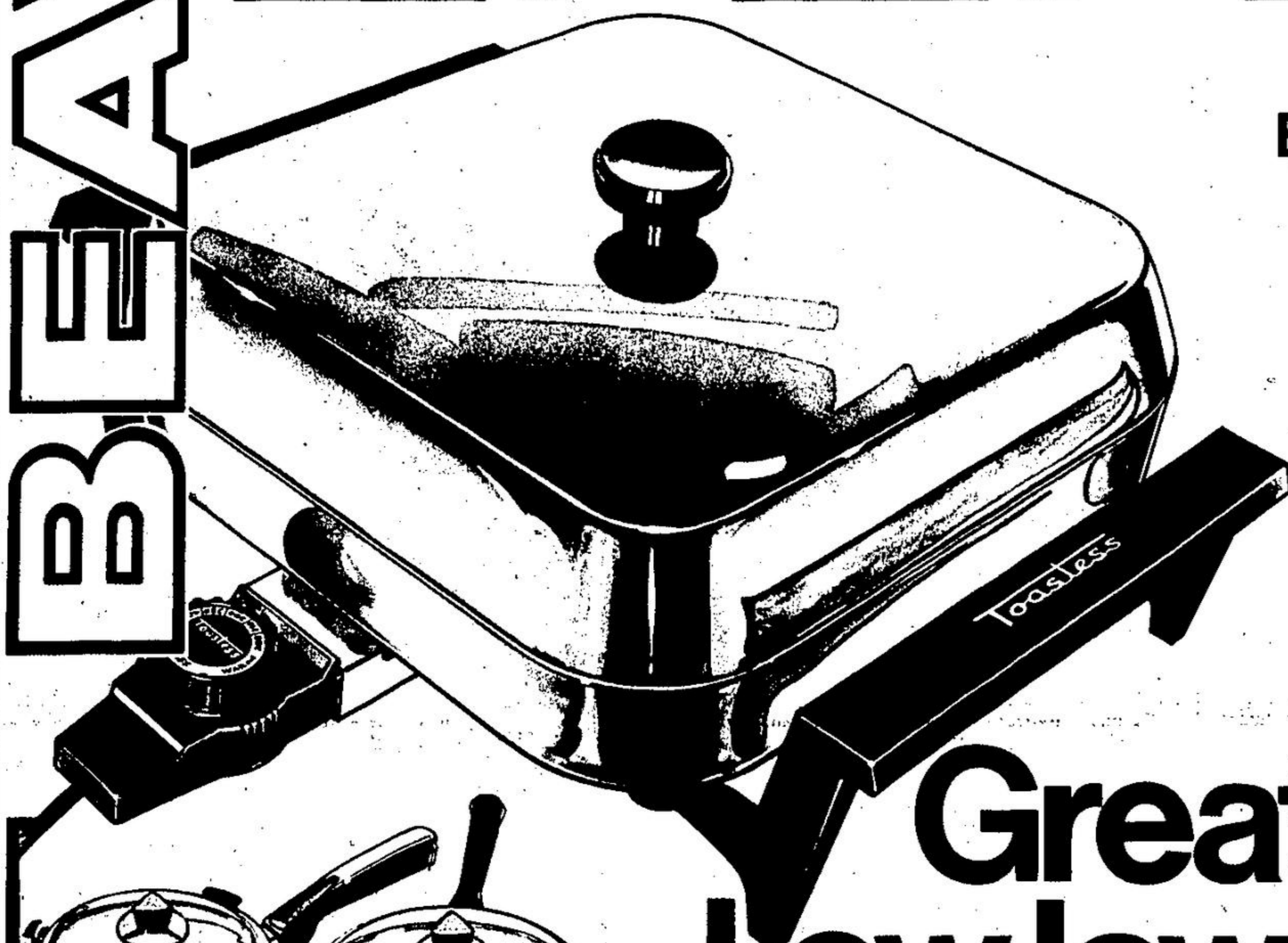

**Ginny's scrumptious sausage dinner**

- 1 lb. sausages
- 2 c. thinly sliced carrots
- 2 tbsp. chopped onion
- 1/2 c. water
- 1/3 c. molasses
- 1/3 c. ketchup
- salt, pepper, Worcestershire sauce to taste
- instant mashed potatoes

Brown sausages. Add carrots and onions. Mix together and add water, molasses and ketchup. Season with salt, pepper and Worcester. Simmer 15-20 min. until carrots are tender. Top with fluffy, prepared instant mashed potatoes. Place under broiler until golden brown.
