Terry O'Connor, Halton MP, failed Monday during the House of Commons question period to gain the necessary consent for a motion stating that the treasury board should correct a "basic inequity."

Mr. O'Connor's motion stated that the treasury board should correct this basic inequity by permitting the transfer of credits from the force and RCMP plans to the Air Canada pension plan.
