## Longtime Norval Resident Ed McLean Dies at Age 66

Edward A. McLean, a longtime resident of Norval, died suddenly at his home following a lengthy illness, Nov. 9. He was in his 66th year.

He was the eldest son of the late Douglas and Ethel McLean of Richmond Hill. He was born in Vaughn Township and attended school at Mount Dennis and Weston. He lived with his parents for several years at Sandhill and at Norval for the past 34 years.

He married Dorothy Watson of Norval on May 8, 1937. They lived at Tottenham for a couple of years and since then have resided in Norval. Mr. McLean worked for Armstrong Brothers Construction Co. of Brampton for about 20 years, and also for Esquering Township and A. V. Roe Co., of Malton for several years. His last position was with Smith and Stone Ltd., of Georgetown for about seven years when he suffered his first severe heart attack.

 He had many hobbies and interests, the main hobby being raising Jacobin pigeons, and he collected many trophies, won in Canadian and United States shows. He judged many of the largest Jacobin shows, in Canada and the U.S. The last big show he judged was the Grand National Pigeon Show at Atlantic City, N.J., in January of 1972.

For several years in the late 1940s and early 1950s, he coached Norval hockey teams in Georgetown and later coached in the minor hockey league in Brampton for several years.

Ed McLean enjoyed trout fishing and hunting and in his later years, enjoyed growing roses in his garden. In his younger years, he trained horses for racing and for shows and held a keen interest in horses all his life.

Funeral services were held Nov. 12 at McClure Jones Funeral Home in Georgetown, with Rev. Walter Ridley of Norval United Church officiating. Pallbearers were Herbert Roslier of Georgetown, Hardy Barnhill of Brampton, Bill Laidlaw, RR 2, Norval, Irwin Parker, RR 2, Brampton, John Hutton, RR 3, Streetsville, and Clinton Handy, Georgetown. Burial was in Hillcrest Cemetery, Norval.

He is survived by his wife, Dorothy; children Ronald of Brampton, Joyce (Mrs. John Hutton) Streetsville, and Irene (Mrs. Clinton Handy) of Georgetown; brothers John S. McLean of Streetsville and Donald of Nova Scotia and a sister, Emma (Mrs. Reg. Bailey) of Brampton, and four grandchildren, Stacey and Alex Hutton, David McLean and Michael Handy.
