TRAMP CHAMPS

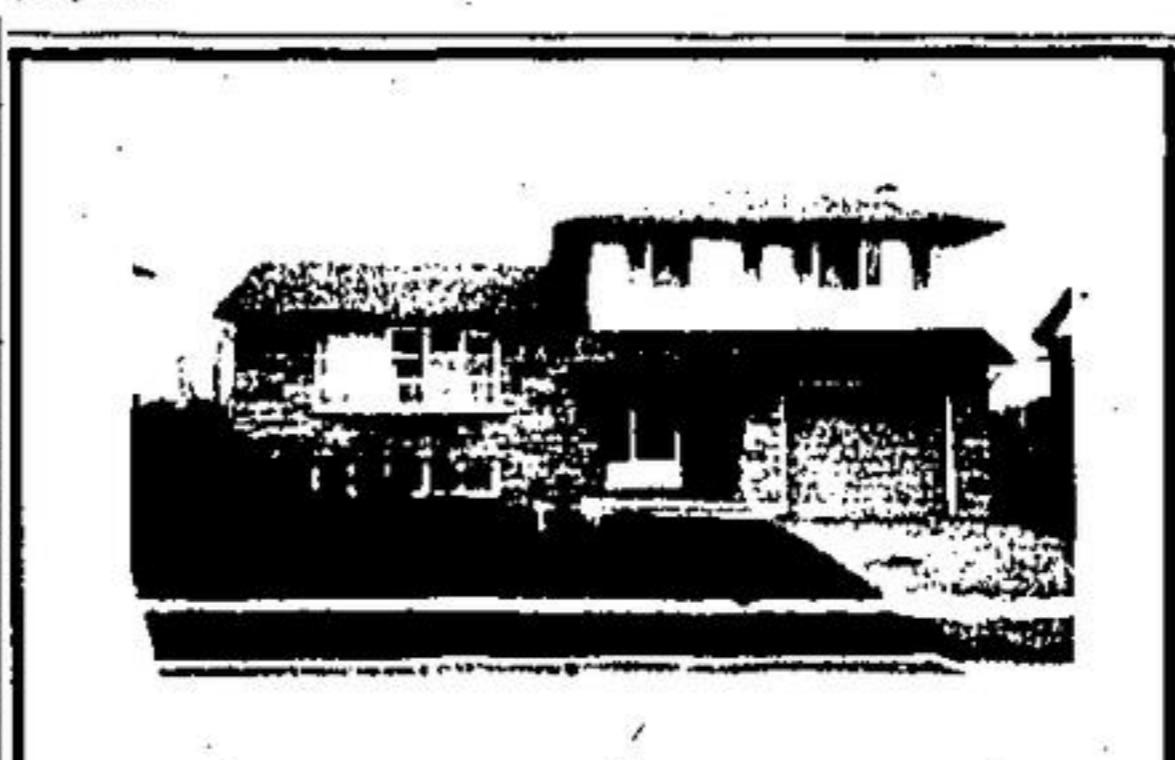
