Polynesian Turkey

| 2 c. left-over turkey | 1 tsp. salt |
| 3 tbsp. butter | 1/4 tsp. pepper |
| 1 large onion | 1 oz. toasted almonds |
| 2 cloves garlic (chopped) | 3 oz. pineapple tidbits |
| 1/2 c. turkey stock | 8 oz. tinned mushrooms |
| 1/4 c. red wine | 1 16 oz. can tomatoes |
| 1/2 tsp. basil | 4 tbsp. flour |
| 1/4 tsp. oregano | |

Saute onion, garlic, mushrooms in butter for 3 min. Add flour. Cook 3 more min., stirring constantly. Add wine, turkey stock and seasonings. Cook until thick and smooth. Add turkey, almonds, tomatoes and pineapple and mix gently. Cook over low heat for 15-20 min., stirring occasionally. Before serving, top with crushed potato chips and sprinkle with paprika. Put under broiler (not too close) for 10 min. Serves 4.
