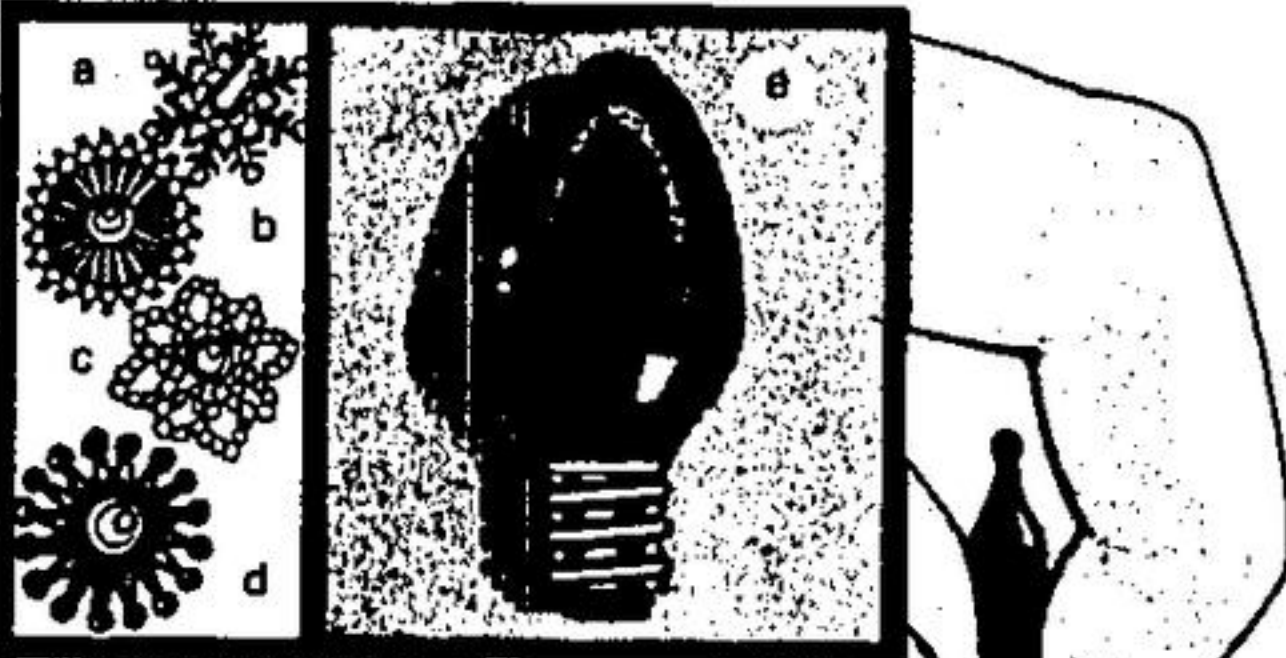

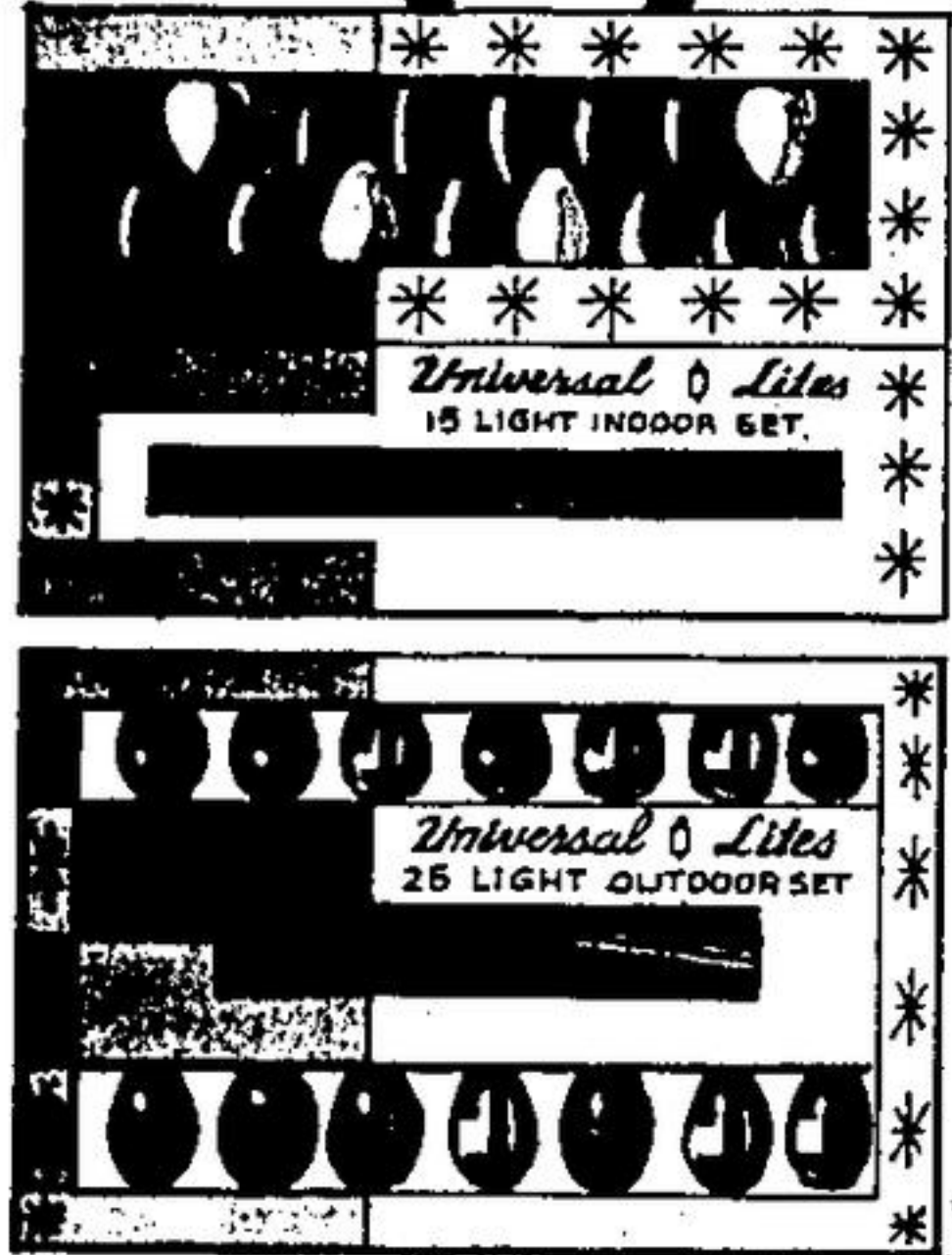

### handyman tips

#### Christmas Decorations: Safety Tips and Ideas to help take trouble out of Christmas Decorating.

1. Always ensure that you don't place too great a load on one circuit.
2. Ensure that you use a heavy-duty extension cord for connections to outdoor lighting. A safe measure.
3. To avoid short circuits, check your extension cords and sockets for damage—if damaged, don't take chances... replace with Beaver cords and lighting sets.
4. Cover outdoor plugs and connectors with a waterproof material to protect them from moisture.
5. To avoid extra-long lengths of extension cords for outdoor lighting, get a Outdoor Plug with weatherproof cap—available at Beaver stores.
6. Here's a great idea for outdoor decorating: Go to Beaver and get a sheet of plywood; cut it into a Santa shape and paint in bright Christmas colours—Beaver stocks the paints you'll require.
7. Indoors, if you're using a natural tree, ensure that the base container is always filled with water—tree lights tend to dry out natural trees, causing a fire hazard.

### They Love White Stuff

The slogan "think snow - stamp out summer" will make people who live in Ontario shudder, but for the half million odd snowmobile enthusiasts it is a sincere wish.  
Some call it snow madness, but for those who enjoy snowmobiling or benefits from its economic impact, it is snow that starts some 140,000 snowmobiles zooming over the Ontario landscape and that is what they want.  
Whatever snowmobiling may mean to you, another season is near and the Ontario Safety League advises everyone involved to get with it and make it a good one.  
Last season the Ontario provincial government revised regulations within the Motorized Snow Vehicle Act to further restrict indiscriminate use of public thoroughfares by snowmobile operators.  
Municipal governments have been given wider powers of control within their jurisdictions.  
It is now mandatory for the operator of a snowmobile on any public thoroughfare to possess a valid motor vehicle operator's licence.  
There are changes which the Ontario Safety League has strongly recommended. It is the league's hope that the result will be a reduction in the number of snowmobile accidents and fatalities occurring on public thoroughfares.
