THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN
BY-LAW NO. 73-68
A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW NO. 48-58

WHEREAS By-law No. 48-58 for The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown is a By-law to provide a special charge on the owners of certain classes of buildings erected or enlarged after the passage of the By-law which might impose a heavy load on the sewer system or water system by reason of which expenditures might be required to provide additional sanitary or storm sewer or water supply capacity for the Town of Georgetown;

AND WHEREAS Council for The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown deems it necessary and advisable to amend the amounts of the special charges imposed under By-law No. 48-58.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown enacts as follows:

1. By-law No. 48-58 for the Town of Georgetown is amended by the deletion of paragraph 2 and the substitution of the following paragraph therefore:

2. From and after the passage of this by-law as a condition of the issuance of a building permit for the erection or enlargement of any of the classes of building set out in Column I of the table below the charges and the amounts set out in Column II of the table in respect of storm and sanitary sewers and water supply facilities shall be payable over and above all other charges, prior to and as a condition of the issuing of such building permit, by the owner of every building in the Town of Georgetown of the type or types described in the said Column I.

COLUMN I	COLUMN II
Row dwellings, multiple family dwellings and double-duplexes - per unit	\$450.00
Bachelor units in apartments - per unit	\$300.00
One bedroom units in apartments - per unit	\$450.00
Two, three or four bedroom units in apartments - per unit	\$600.00
Boarding houses, residences or clubs - per building plus an additional \$70.00 for each bedroom in excess of twelve in each such building.	\$850.00

2. This By-law shall take effect on the day it is passed by Council of The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown, subject to the approval of The Ontario Municipal Board.
