

**GLEN WILLIAMS**

Recently, there have been several complaints from residents, about dogs being a real nuisance around the Glen village area. Last week, a resident couple were out for a stroll with their two year old son, and without any warning, their young son was attacked and bitten by a neighborhood dog. This particular incident would have been much more serious, if the young child had not been dressed in his heavy winter clothing.

Mr. Herrington, dog controller for the Township, has been having some difficulty contacting the owner of this dog, to advise him of the necessity of keeping the dog confined to his property. Many parents have shown a recent concern for involvement of their children with similar encounters, causing a fear to the child walking to and from school. Some of the parents are apparently becoming quite hostile about the situation.

Four mothers have reported incidents of their own children being bothered or frightened by dogs every day. A few of these children have dogs of their own, and their respect for animals has turned to fear. Over the past year, both children and adults, have reported being seriously bitten by different dogs in the Glen area. It dogs are to continue being called "Man's best friend," perhaps more stringent laws should be enforced, to enable us to retain this belief and to help eliminate these increasing problems.

"The Group," as they are called, a young musical group from Oakville, entertained over 100 people from both, St. Alban's Anglican Church, in the Glen, and St. Paul's Church in the street, in St. Paul's parish hall, Sunday evening, Nov. 25. Both young and old enjoyed the music, even though it was primarily for the interest of young people. A combination of singing and guitars were incorporated into a religious play, entitled, "Act Two." The first act, was songs on love and life, and the second act, was about Christ. The audience was very impressed by the singing, acting talents, put forth by the group. This group tours various churches around the diocese. A collection was taken, and half of the proceeds went to a charity of the groups choice.

Refreshments followed, with the audiences participation in a sing-song led by this inspiring, interdenomination group.

The congregation of St. John's United Church, in the Glen, listened to a very interesting speaker, at the Sunday morning service, on Nov. 25. Mr. Ronald French, the project director of Christ College in Princes Town, Trinidad, spoke about this college, which gives instruction to boys in various trades, and skills, training them for the job market, in a time of serious unemployment in Trinidad.

Mr. French, pointed out, that pretty well all commercial business, employment, and activity, exists in Northern Trinidad. The south is poor, with small holdings, basically farming land, with just enough to eat for a mere existence. Mr. French's position, is with the United church, and is being given assistance from the Rotary Club in Toronto. Some of the Ontario Highschools have also donated equipment, for this project. Woodworking and welding, are a couple of the skills which are taught. Mr. French was born in England, raised in East Africa, and is widely travelled. He is here in Canada, on furlough, with his wife and three children, living in the Toronto area. He stated, that many of the boys in Southern Trinidad, are begging to attend his school.

The Creation Story, was recently presented by the Sunday school class, at St. Paul's church in Norval, led by Mrs. Lynn Ruggles, of the Glen. The children, ranging in age from six to ten years old, performed, with the use of colored slides, they themselves had taken of a variety of animals and wildlife in our area. All the children took part in the performance, giving a very interesting, as well as humorous portrayal of the "Creation Story". It is hoped that they will give a repeat performance, for the children at St. Alban's church, here in the Glen.
