Georgetown minor midgets journeyed to Milton on Monday Dec. 10 and came home with a 4-1 loss in a penalty riddled game.

Coach Vaughn Thompson was ready to throw in the towel as the result of the teams performance in this game as he and manager, Gord Monk were thoroughly fed up with the manner in which the boys of both teams conducted themselves.

In the first period after only 90 seconds of play, Georgetown had two minor penalties and were playing two men short when Milton scored at 1:13. The period went scoreless after this but was chippy throughout and Bill Hanley of Georgetown was put out of the game for fighting. In the second, Georgetown tied the score at 2:45 on a play by Jeff Coulligan to Peter Boyle. These two boys were two of the few who stuck to playing hockey and played outstanding in a losing cause.

Again, with Georgetown playing shorthanded, Milton went ahead at the 3:40 mark. In the last stanza, Georgetown decided to play alley hockey and of the fifteen minutes of regulation time for a period, they had no more than three men on the ice for approximately 12 minutes of the 15. Add to this display, one misconduct to each team. While Georgetown were busy with the rewinging, Milton added two more goals to give them the 4 to 1 game.

Vaughn Thompson and Gord Monk spoke with the Milton team's coach and manager after the game and all were fairly disgusted at the play and attitudes of both teams.

Juveniles next game will be in Brampton, Tuesday, Dec. 18 at 9:30 p.m.



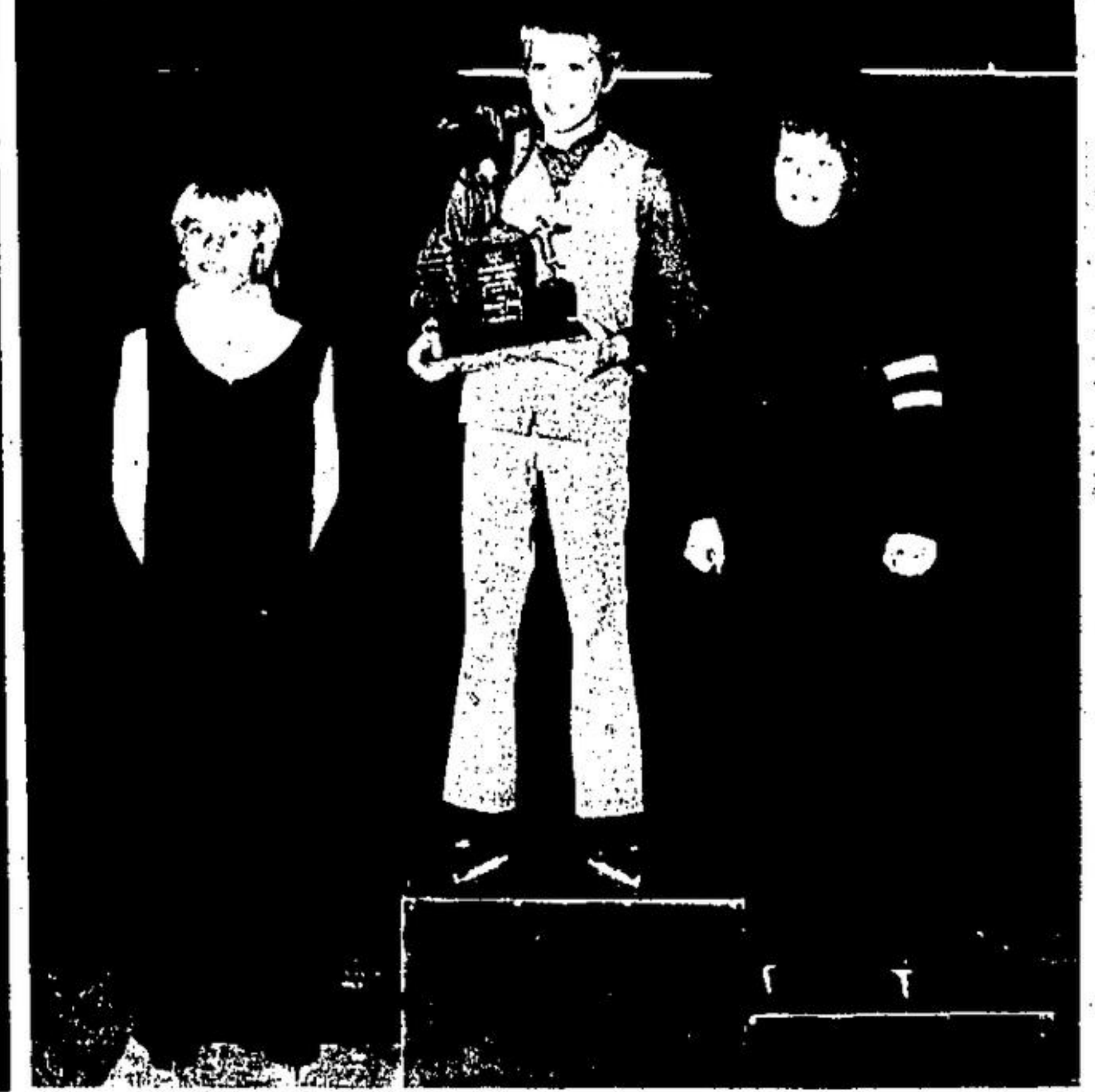

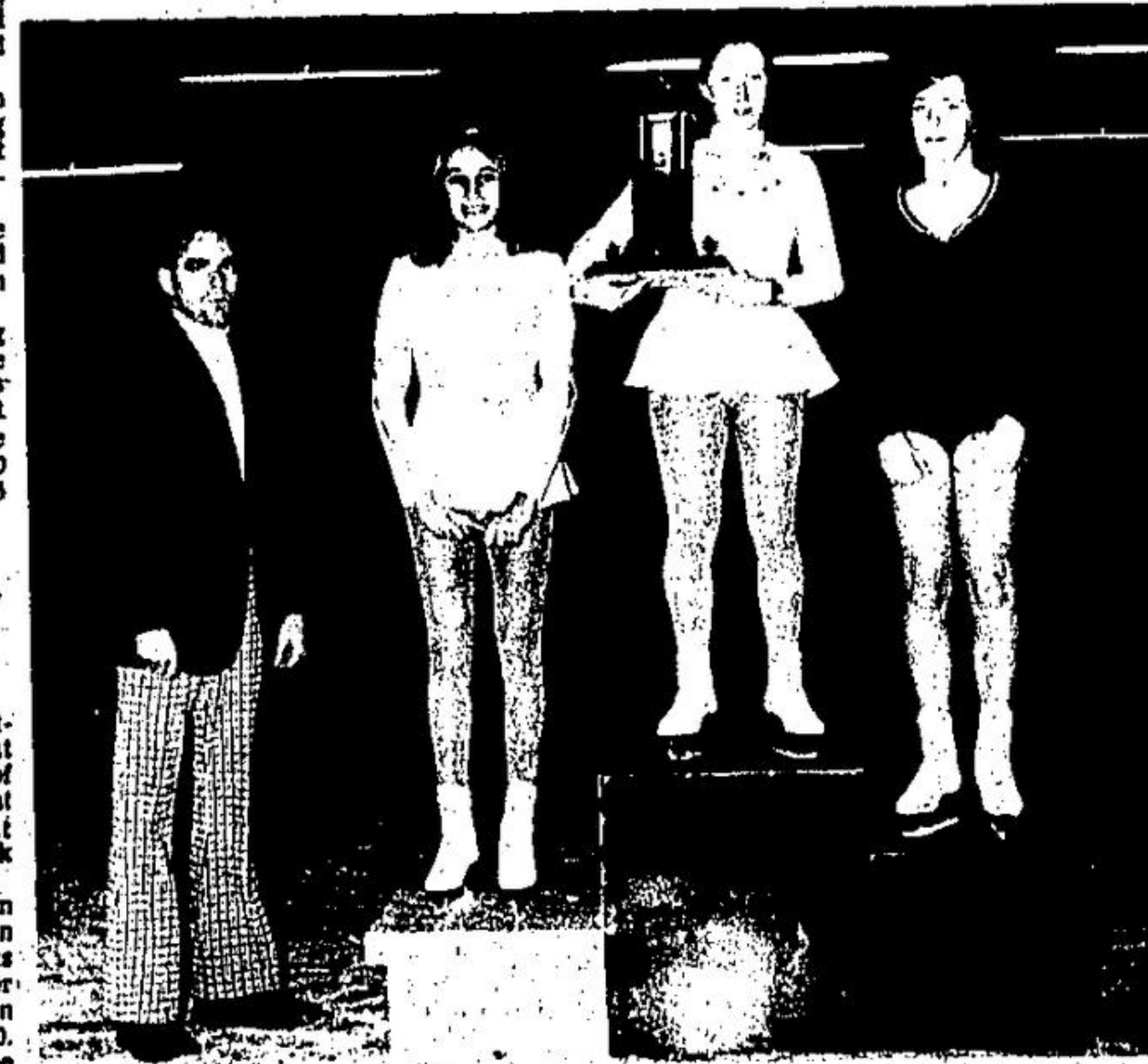

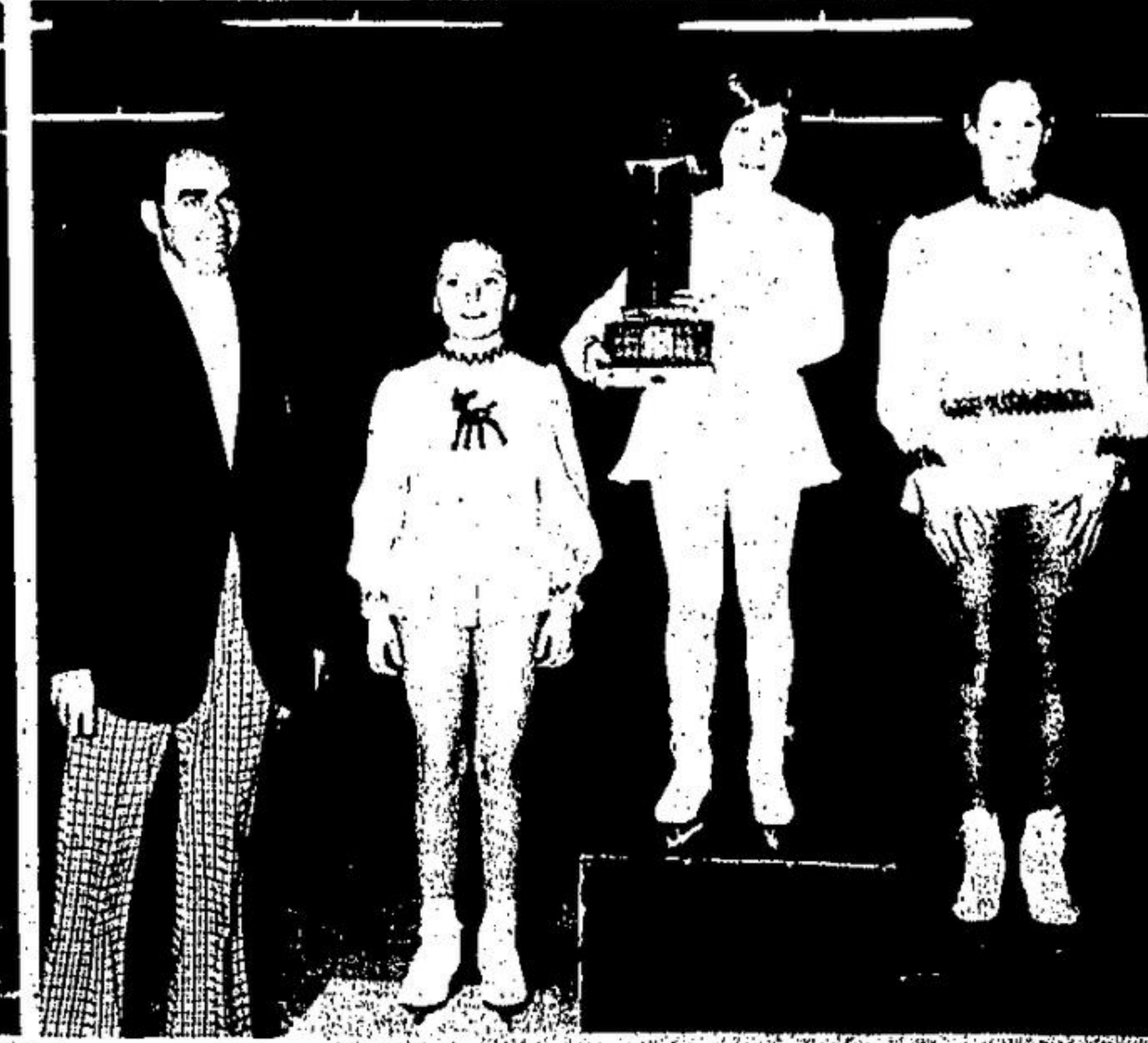
