Soviet's Yule Is Like Our's Except.

A visitor to the officially atheistic nation of the Soviet Union at Christmastime would see very little that differs from western nations' customs.

Colored lights, decorated trees, gift-laden shoppers and images of a bearded, befurred old gentleman delivering toys from a sleigh...these and other traditional sights greet the eye.

The one significant difference is that the Russian Christmas has been shorn of any religious meaning, officially at least.

There are some isolated instances of Christian worship in Russia at this time.

Russian Orthodox Christmas is celebrated with an 8-hour Christmas Mass at midnight in a few churches. This mass takes place, not on December 25, but on January 7 in conformity with the old Julian calendar. To this day the Mass is splendid, involving all the rich orthodox pageantry of the 19th century, in the days of the Czars. It still brings thousands of faithful souls into cathedrals to participate.

The richest mass is sung in Moscow's Yelokhovsky (Epiphany) Cathedral. Six priests, resplendently garbed, sing the Slavonic ritual in rich baritone and bass voices with accompaniment from two choirs high in a loft above the
