Self-Defence For Local Women

A self-defence course for women will be starting here on Wednesday, February 6, at 7:30 p.m. The instructor will be Mr. Ron Forrester, a 5th degree Black Belt in Jiu Jitsu, who has established several other successful classes. The eight week course is sponsored by the Georgetown Budokan Judo Club and will be held in the Rose Room above the arena. "There are still enough miniskirts around to create the need for such a course", said instructor Ron Forrester. He said women carry an arsenal around with them and he is going to show them how to use it. "A loud scream is one of the best weapons available but they also have sharp-heeled shoes, combs, nailfiles and purses with metal corners," said Forrester. He plans to teach them some new ways to fight assailants. "The frailest little thing can break any man's wrist when she goes about it right", he said.

"The strength of her two arms and her body can be applied to that one small joint." The women will spend one hour each Wednesday evening learning the ability to defend themselves through the use of specially designed techniques in Jiu Jitsu, aikido, karate, and judo.
