**Gilbert, Tate, Tibbitts Excel Raiders Down Dundas, 7-5**

Gilbert, Tate and Tibbitts. Three names, with a lot of scoring power. Sunday, the trio powered the Georgetown Raiders to a 7-5 decision over Dundas Merchants in an intermediate A contest in Georgetown.

The group carried so much of the play, that perhaps the executive of the hockey club should have them bronzed and put on display at the arena during the off season, a tribute to super hockey.

Tom Gilbert scored four goals, and earned one assist. He even picked up one penalty.

Doug Tate got five assists, on all the Gilbert goals, plus one by Junior Tibbitts. Besides his goal, Tibbitts had one assist.

Peter Kennedy was another strong man for the Raiders, scoring once and assisting once. Ray Evans provided the other home marker, and got an assist too.

For the first half of the game, it appeared the Raiders were suffering from the absence of Paul Robinson and Blake Inglis, two players of late who have helped immensely in the goal-scoring department. Then the bomb went off. The Gilbert, Tate, Tibbitts line got the range and set off a barrage of scoring that put the home club back into the game and on the path to victory.

Georgetown took the lead in the game, when Evans scored mid-way through the first period. That wasn't much of a taste of things to come until the second, when the Merchants blasted off. Pete Aussem got the equalizer, followed by teammates Doug Cook and Gerry Pearson. Raiders got back into the game on the first Gilbert goal, then saw the gap widened once more, when Pearson scored again for Dundas.

Netminder Keith Pallett set the stage for the Raider attack, when he shovelled the puck up the ice to Doug Tate, who carried the play into the Dundas end of the ice, then passed to Tom Gilbert for the goal. That was at the 31-second mark. At 6:53, Gilbert scored again, followed by Mike Alkerton of the Merchants. Gilbert tied the game again, with Tibbitts following the winning goal and Kennedy providing the insurance.

The Merchants are back in Georgetown Friday, for another go against the high-flying Raiders.

**OFFSIDES**

The Dundas goal by Alkerton was a long, fast slapshot in the third period. He was at the

blueline where he took Doug Cook's pass, and he let go a high shot that went into the net past Pallett's left shoulder. But Pallett came up with a number of big saves, including a goal-pad catch that thwarted Cook from less than five feet away...

Program draw was won Sunday by Ron Kavanagh of Georgetown, and he left the arena richer by \$35. He picked Ray Tonelli to take the centre ice shot, and Tonelli scored. Ray was a busy man on the ice for the Raiders, but the only scoring he did was during the draw.

There weren't many penalties in the game, but on the few opposition ones that were handed out, Georgetown was hard put to score. One of two power play goals of the game for the home team came on the last tally, after Dundas' Bill Nunn was tagged for slashing.

Third Dundas goal came from close in while the Raiders were in the process of clearing the puck from their end of the ice. Another close shot was scored by Pearson, his second of the night, when he backhanded a shot into the Georgetown net...

Ron Gignac was originally listed on the Dundas player list, but didn't play and his absence probably contributed to the Dundas loss. Roster additions were Doug and Steve Aglor.

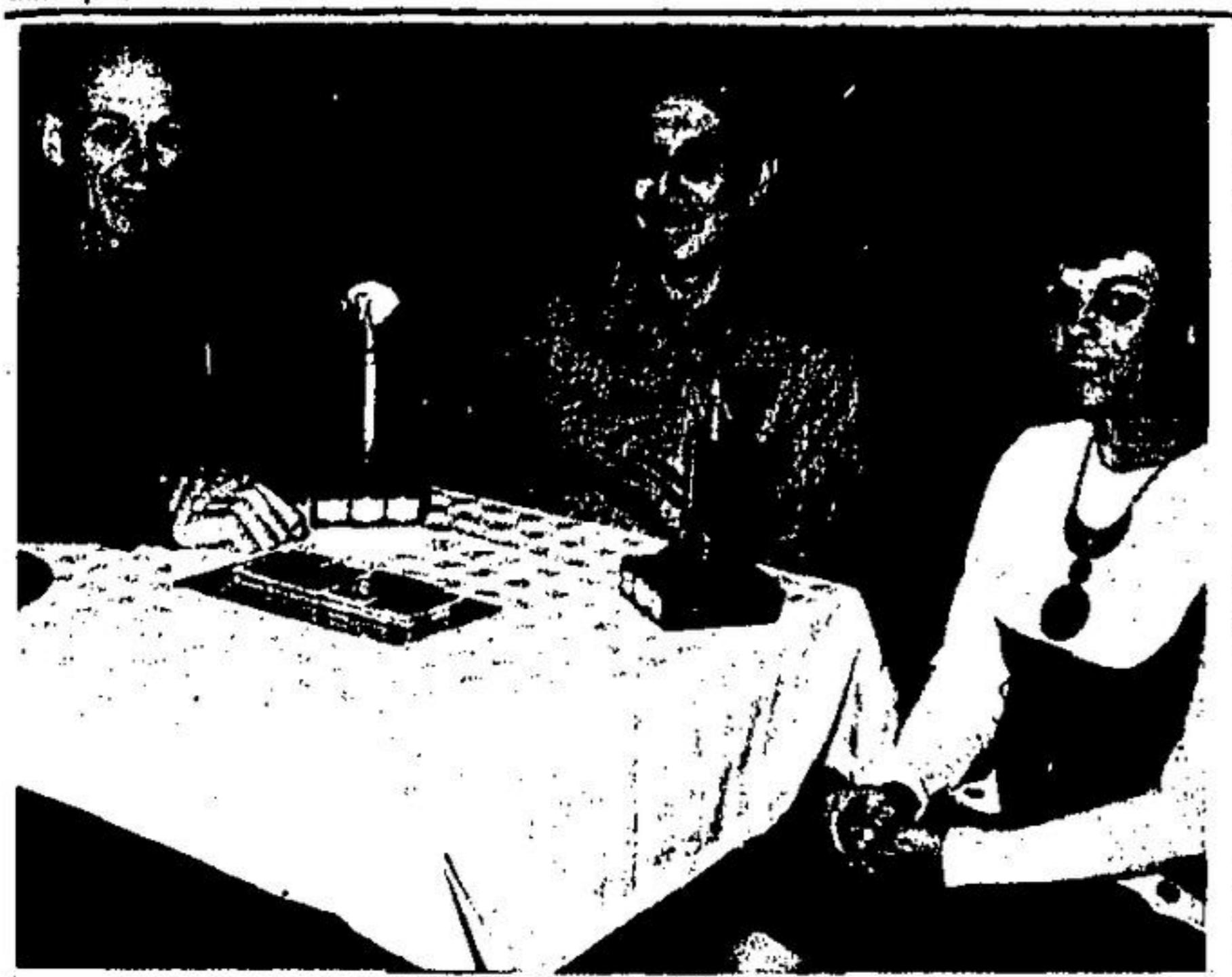
