Contracts For Firms

Two Georgetown firms were awarded Federal government contracts totalling \$80,483. Varian Associates of Canada Ltd. received two contracts. One is worth \$50,452 and is for the company to supply electron tubes. The other, valued at \$29,000 is for the production of instruments. Gage Stationary Company will be paid \$10,031 for supplying the government with stationary. The three contracts were among 252 unclassified contracts in the \$10,000 or more category awarded to Canadian companies by the Department of Supply and Services during last week. The Department's weekly bulletin of business opportunities said, "the total value of these contracts placed on behalf of various federal departments and agencies was \$27,258,142."

Snowmobile Rally Aids Area Minor Hockey
