Two visitors to the Halton Hills council left a regular meeting this week more confused than enlightened.

The two women, Carol McMurray and MaryLou Brock attended on behalf of the Georgetown University Women's Club.

"We were concerned about the apathetic attitude of citizens and about our own attitudes," Mrs. McMurray explained.

She said the club decided to send two members to all regular council meetings. The two members are to report back to the six women club.

But the ladies' discovery this week that council watching is not as easy as it sounds.

"Our job is to record how they voted," Mrs. McMurray said. "We were to say that he voted for this, and he voted for that, but it's been impossible."

The ladies complained that little clarification was made of the subjects councillors discussed. Their problem was increased as they lacked an agenda, but Mrs. Brock observed that "it wouldn't help much anyway."

"The meeting is filled with the nagging details of administration," she noted. "It's boring to watch."

The exasperated ladies' left at 11 p.m., two hours before the meeting finally ground to a halt.

Policeman Charged

With Assault

A Halton Region police officer is scheduled to appear in provincial court here March 12 to face a charge of assault.

Sgt. Frank Arthur, of the Georgetown detachment, was charged after a complaint was laid by Lawrence Adams who alleged that an assault took place in the police station after he was arrested and charged with impaired driving last Nov. 1.

Adam's charge of impaired driving was dismissed in court last week after his lawyer noted a spelling error on the breathalyzer certificate. The letter "t" was left out of the word "blood".

Crown Attorney John Treleaven said another judge and Crown attorney will be brought in from outside once a trial date is set.

"A charge of assault against a policeman is very serious and he could lose his job if convicted," said Mr. Treleaven.

"During my two years here, I remember receiving one other complaint of assault against a policeman, but this is the first time a charge has been laid."
