## Raiders Sink Sailors Clinch Second Place

What a difference one game can make. If Georgetown Raiders had won one more regular season game, they could have finished in top spot in the league.

Instead, the intermediate A defending hockey champs ended regular 1973-74 play one point out of first place. The Raiders wrapped up the season, Friday night, with an 8-5 win over the Port Colborne Sailors, to finish one point behind that club in final standings.

But it was a rousing finish to the season. The Raiders battled to an easy win, handling out more lumps than they received. The score could have been a greater edge than indicated, because two final goals by the visitors came when the Raiders, heavily penalized in the third period, were two men short.

Ray Tonelli and Ray Evans paced the Raiders' victory. Each picked up two goals. Singles were scored by Dave McMenemy, Pete Kennedy, Duane Rutley and Tom Gilbert.

Gilbert opened the scoring, barely a minute into the game. The Sailors bounced back with two quick goals, and then lost

the initiative to the Raiders for the remainder of the game. After Port Colborne goals by Gino Farinacci and Brian Kilpatrick, Tonelli scored his pair and Rutley added his. The Sailors concluded the high-scoring first period with another goal by Farinacci.

Second period scoring belonged to the Raiders, with McMenemy and Evans doing the honors. The Sailors got two easy goals in the third, the hat-trick marker by Farinacci, and a final goal by Mike Green. Evans wrapped up the Raiders scoring.

In the dying minutes of the game, the Raiders lost the services of John Boyce and Bill Currie. Both were tossed out of the match on game misconducts, arising from an on-ice brouhaha. Wayne Gallinger got the gate for the visitors, as did Brian Kilpatrick.

Gilbert scored during the game for the Raiders but he missed a \$5 shot for Shirley Humphrey, winner of the program draw. Bob Stewart of Port Colborne faced 51 shots on goal while Keith Pallett of the Raiders had 22. Pallett also picked up a penalty in the third period, when he left his goal crease during a row. Don Norton served the two minutes.

Two goals by Evans for the Raiders came during power plays in the second period. Jean Latulippe picked up one

of the penalties when he fell on the puck during a Raider attack. His subsequent absence from the ice led to a goal.
