

Georgetown Teams Place High In 4-Town Hockey Tournament

Georgetown and District Minor Hockey Association played host to the 1974 4-Town Tournament last Saturday with teams from Orangeville, Acton, Streetsville and Georgetown as participants. This is strictly a house league tournament for atom, peewee, bantam and midget teams. Some excellent hockey was played in front of a large and enthusiastic audience. Two Georgetown teams, Hamco Bantams and Noseworthy Midgets were strong winners in their class. The Mac's Milk Atom team lost the championship on penalty shots and the Nelson Real Estate Pee Wees were consolation winners. The holder of the winning ticket in the tournament draw, a \$50.00 bond, was a Georgetown mother, Mrs. Wainwright, who was helping with the time keeping.
