Cambridge Bowlers Take Master-Junior Title

Last Sunday at Sportsman's Bowlerama in Guelph, 132 Master Bowlers and Junior bowlers from Collingwood, Listowel, Kitchener, Waterloo, Cambridge, Guelph, Brampton, Milton, Acton, Bramalea and Georgetown met for the 10th annual master-junior tournament regional finals. Forty-four teams competed, each composed of one Master Bowler, one junior girl and one junior boy. The final tally saw a team from Presto Lanes in Cambridge win with a score of 3211. Master bowler Marilyn Dickson and juniors Christine Korney and Barry Melski didn't shoot a game under 200 as they won by over 200 pins. Christine won the girls high triple award with her 716 while Barry captured the same award for the boys with a nice 786 triple.

In second place, with 2979, were master John Cooper and juniors Carol Mattice and Kevin Waddell of Collingwood Lanes in Collingwood.

Colin Hicks, one of our junior bowlers rolled a nice 747 triple. It was the second highest junior boys triple of the tournament. Stephanie Cox, also of Georgetown, threw a three game total of 681 - the third highest triple among the junior girls.

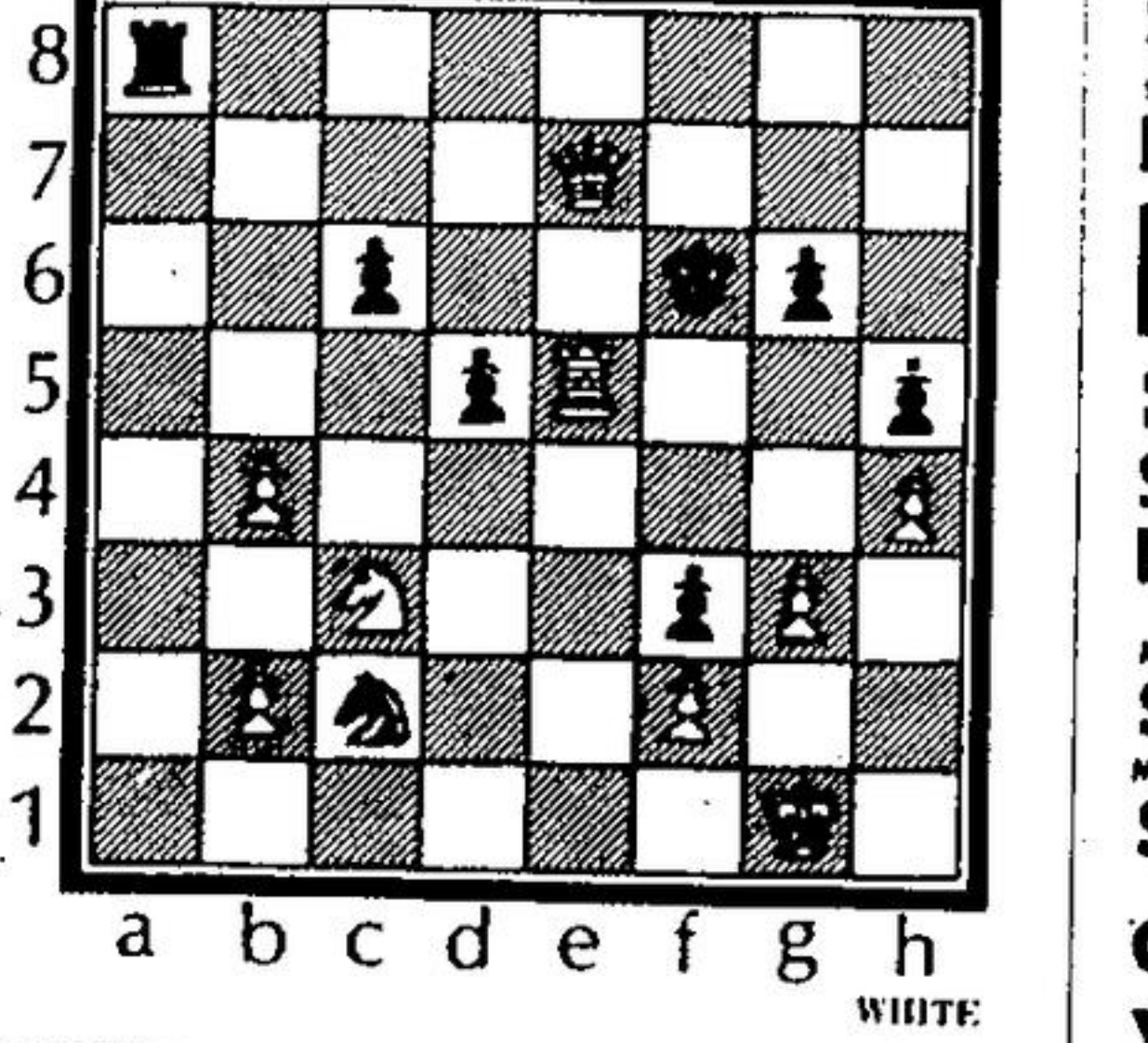

The following game, played in round 6, clinched first prize for MacLeod.

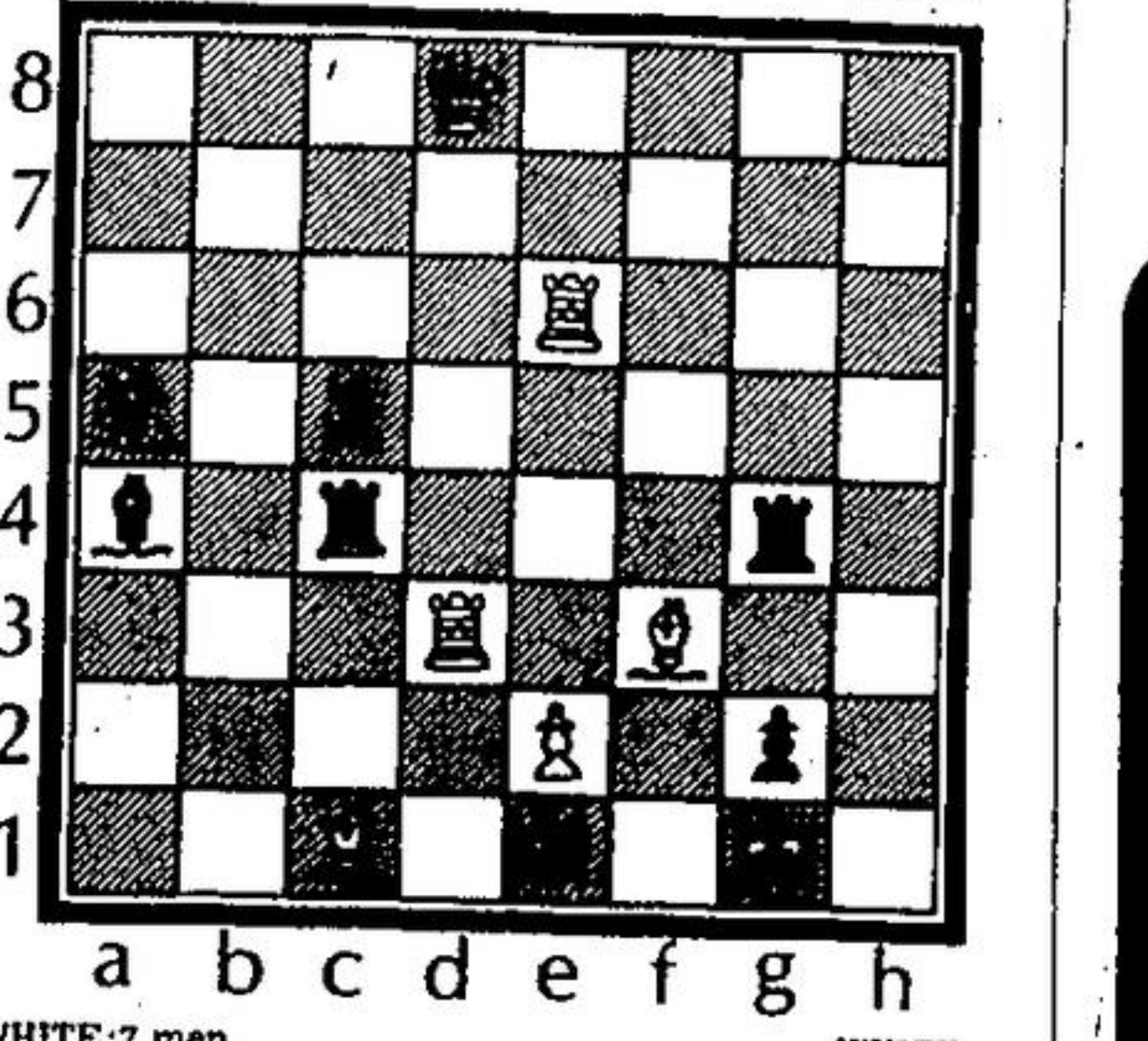
