Little Theatre Scores Well With Neil Simon Production

Last minute change in production could work to the advantage of Georgetown Little Theatre.
A Neil Simon play was presented during the weekend, instead of the originally scheduled comedy, Rape of the Bell, and becomes the theatre group's entry in the 1974 Central Ontario Drama Festival.
Adjudicator John Saxton had only relatively minor criticisms to offer, and he seemed to enjoy the production as much as the audiences who attended the three stagings.
Georgetown Little Theatre will learn April 6 how well its production fared.
Casting problems forced cancellation of the original production. In its place, the group chose a Neil Simon work, Plaza Suite. Another Neil Simon play, Barefoot in The Park, will be produced in May.
Choice of the Simon play for the drama competition was a good one. Neil Simon is a New York writer with a flair for wit and comedy, and his play, Plaza Suite, left director Derek Joynea, who is little theatre president, and his cast with considerable room for interpretation.
The play is set in a New York hotel (Simon likes to write about familiar things, and New York is most familiar to him), the Plaza, and its concern is with the characters who people one room. Broad is the range of human experience that is set out in the play, and there is wide diversity of characterization.
Because Simon is essentially a humorist, the play deals in humor. There is a strong strand of humor that is woven through the experiences of three sets of occupants of the Plaza Suite.
Presentation was every bit as effective as it was for the season opener, Present Laughter, a Noel Coward play.
Ron Hill, a veteran member of the theatre group, had the demanding task of appearing in all three acts, playing Sam Nash in Visitor from Mamaroneck, Jesse Kiplinger in Visitor from Hollywood and Roy Hubley in Visitor from Frost Hills. In the latter act, Mary Goebel, best remembered for an effective characterization in the Noel Coward play, was Norma Hubley. The two, with Ed Arcuri as Borden Eisler and Karen Friskney as Mimsey Hubley, helped make act three probably the best part of the production.
CASTING
Another Ron, Ron Hunt, was the waiter in act two. Ron was last seen in Present Laughter, as Fred, the valet. Playing opposite him and Ron Hill was Pat Joynea, a versatile member of the little theatre, whom children will recall as Sad the Clown, in the Christmas production of Jack and the Giant.
Another member from that Christmas production is Joanne Grant, who was Happy the Clown. In Plaza Suite, she played an effective Karen Nash (Ron Hunt was a waiter in this, also. Is he getting typecast?) Tom Van Alphen, who can handle a variety of roles, played a bellhop, and Michele Mole was Jean McCormack.
Derek Joynea, besides being a performing member of Georgetown Little Theatre, has directed before, and his handling of the play showed he is no novice. He extracts as polished a performance from his players as any professional director, and because he has worked both on stage and off, he has a commanding appreciation of all nuances and touches of business that help make a successful production.
John Horning was producer for the play, with John Lupton as stage manager. Lighting was under the direction of Harvey Lee and Roger Heed, with sound by Villem Tedder. Set construction was in the hands of Gorn Hunt, Brian Herner, Garry Grant and Mr. Lupton and Mr. Horning. Makeup was by Isla McCormack, Sue Dunning and Ann Joyce.

Zoning Conflict Looms In Acton, Esqueusing

Conflicting zoning bylaws in the former town of Acton and township of Esqueusing are causing problems for a proposed 29 lot development in the south west part of Acton.
The development is located on the west side of Mill Street and is half in Acton and half in Esqueusing. The land zoned in Acton is for serviced land development, but in Esqueusing there is no designated land codes for serviced land.
Therefore, a developer could build on land using septic tanks but not on land with a sewer system.
Blair Davies, representing the developers and the Acton Legion, proposed an amendment of Esqueusing's zoning bylaw recognizing serviced land.
However, members of Halton Hills general administration committee explained that the bylaw had not passed an OMB hearing and could not be amended until it had.
"The problem we have is that before the zoning bylaw is approved, we want to amend the thing," explained Coun. Ric Morrow.
Chairman of the committee Roy Booth suggested that they agreed to the development of lots one to eight and 19 to 28 in the 29 LPT Survey.
After he was told this, Mr. Davies said he would have to have approval from the Acton Legion. He added that road construction would take more money for the project.
"First the roads will be built with turnarounds and hammerheads instead of straight dead ends. Then if it passes through Esqueusing the roads will have to be reconstructed through the remainder of the survey."
The Acton legion proposed the single family development to help finance the construction of their new building.
