

## Raiders Advance To East-Can. Intermediate 'A' Semi-Finals

The Georgetown Raiders progressed to the semi-finals of the Eastern Canadian Intermediate A Championship on Saturday night, March 30. They beat the Lively Cyclones 10-3 which, together with their 5-2 victory on Friday night, gave them the best of three series.

In both games, the Cyclones scored first. On Friday night, Terry Cryderman of the Cyclones scored at 2:22 of the first period. It wasn't until 14:55 that Tom Gilbert brought Georgetown level, at then in the last minute of the first period, at the 18:23 mark, Pele Kennedy put Georgetown ahead. Ray Tonelli added two goals in the second period: one at 1:17 and 12:39. Doug Tate finished the Georgetown scoring with a goal at 3:21 of the third period. Lively got one back at 11:58 with a goal by Don Moses, but the result was beyond dispute at that stage.

On Saturday night, the Raiders went for a quick victory, but once again it was the Cyclones who scored first with an incredibly quick goal by Rick Kulyksi after only 15 seconds of the first period. The Raiders replied with first period goals at 3:19, 10:23 and 16:23, scored by Duane Rutley, Blake Inglis and Pete Kennedy respectively. The Cyclones didn't give up however. The game could have gone either way in the second period when John Dediana scored for Lively at 11:57. The Raiders then won on a rampage. Ray Tonelli scored at 12:32. Ray Evans added another at 14:18 and Tom Gilbert got the first of his three goals at 15:00. In less than three minutes, the Raiders had put the issue beyond doubt.

In the third period, Stitt made it 7-2 with a goal at 1:17, and then the Cyclones hit back as Paul Brunelle scored at 4:10. Doug Tate, added yet another at 5:33 and then Tom Gilbert scored twice, at 6:20 and 11:42.

The second game had been a rough one. Georgetown collected nine penalties to the Cyclones eight and Rutley and Kulyksi had a private scrap. Georgetown outshot Lively 38-27.

**SEMI-FINALS**  
The Raiders now progress to the semi-finals where they will

play the Embrun Panthers. The matches will be played on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, April 5, 6, 7 at Embrun, who have reached the semi-finals for the third year in a row. To reach this far they have beaten Gatineau, four games to one, and Shawville four games to nil. They have also won their

league, the Ottawa Valley Intermediate A League, for the fourth year in a row, and pose stiff opposition for the Raiders. Should the Raiders beat Embrun, they will stage the final at Georgetown; playing the winner of the Western Canadian Intermediate A Championship.

## SOCCER NOTES

At the minor soccer level everything is taking shape. Coaches of our representative teams have to submit names of the players selected before April 11. The Halton Peel league games will start May 13, 1974.

Brian Turner, chief of referees, reports that another clinic will be held Sat. April 6, at 11 a.m. at Cedarvale and we hope to see many coaches, managers and referees (or to be attend these clinics. We will see all our representative teams play in red shorts and red and white

striped jerseys, including the Georgetown Falcons, to make it official Georgetown colors. We also have a design made for a Georgetown crest so that we are easy to be identified when playing out of town. In May we will have ten Squirt teams this year in our house league. Some coaches are still needed for these teams.

In Minor Atom we have: The Boomerangs, Thunderbirds, Tigers, Eagles, Bombers and Golden Jets.

In Major Atom we have: Bobcats, Grizzlies, Dynamos, Colts, Falcons and Pineview.
