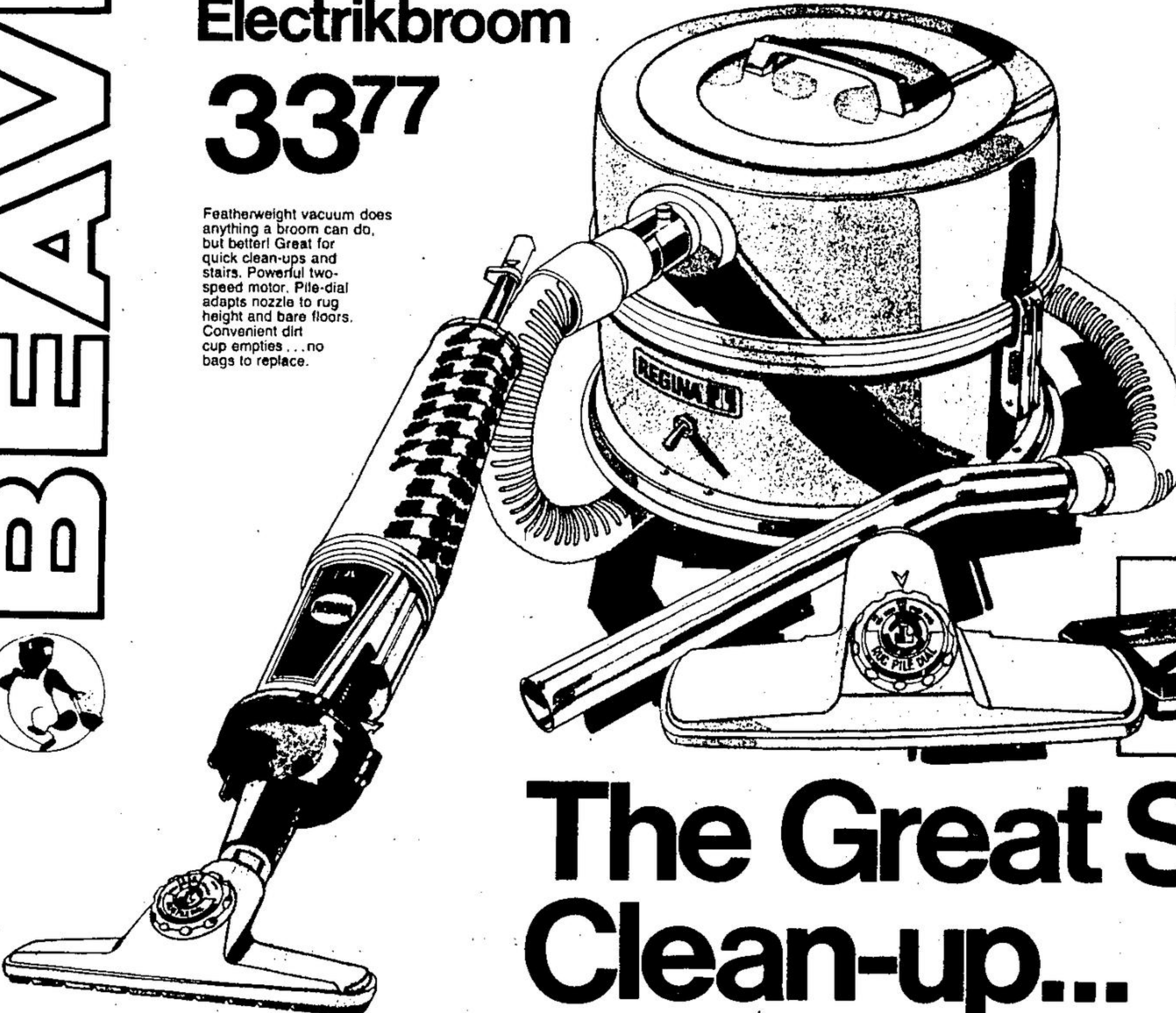

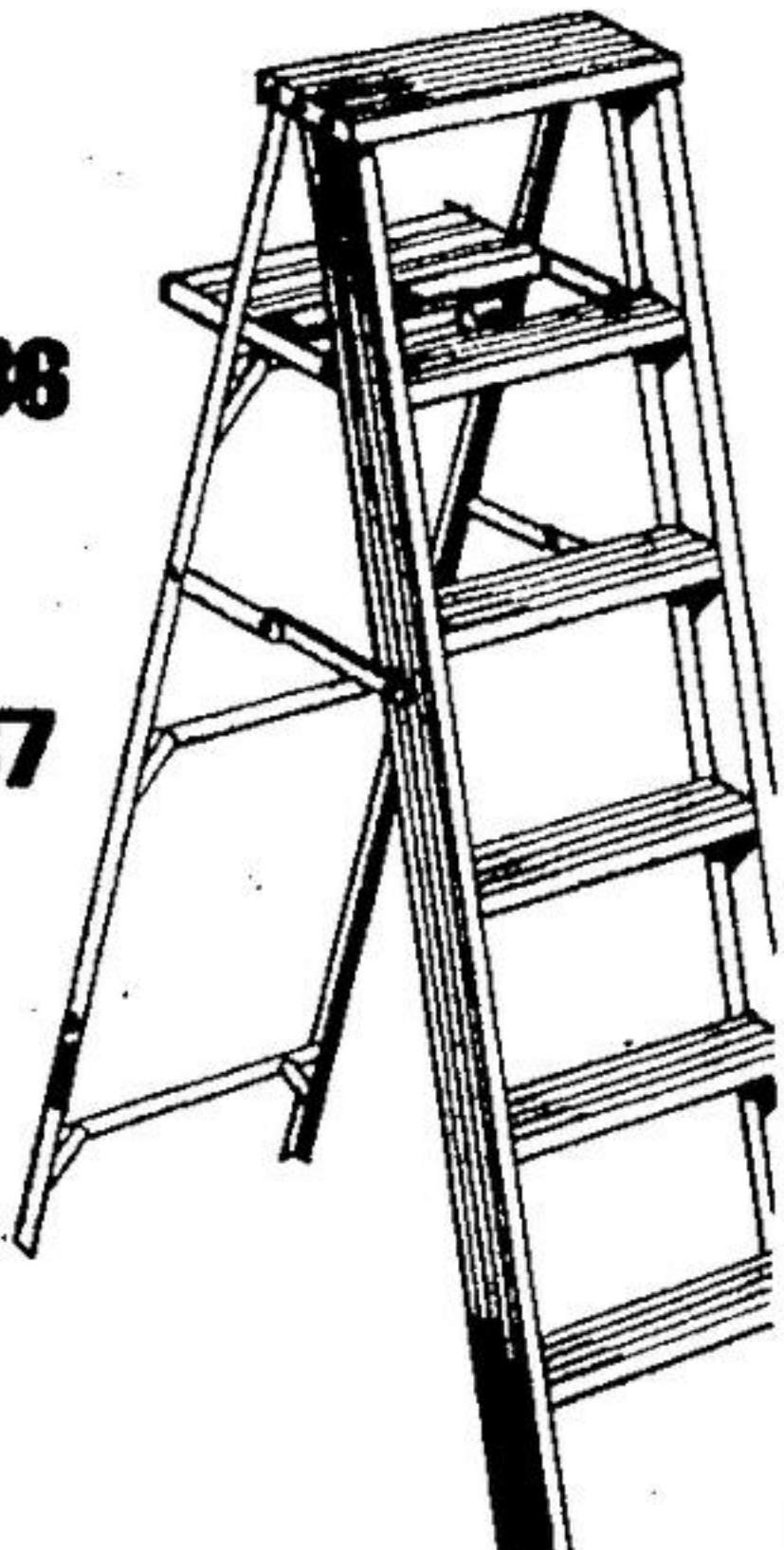

Spring Cleaning

Rubber Heel Marks on vinyl floors can be removed with petroleum solvent such as Mac Eachern Wax Stripper.

Wax Build-Up. Self-polishing wax needs ammonia solution and scrubbing with stiff brush. For other waxes use solvent-type wax remover, such as Mac Eachern Wax Stripper.

Black-Stained Hardwood Floors. Place soft cloth soaked in concentrated oxalic acid on spot until stain is gone.

Stained Walls around heat registers can be cleaned with solution of trisodium phosphate sold at Beaver.

Removing Cellulose Tape from walls is difficult. Try heating it with warm iron. A petroleum solvent or nail polish remover may then remove the adhesive.

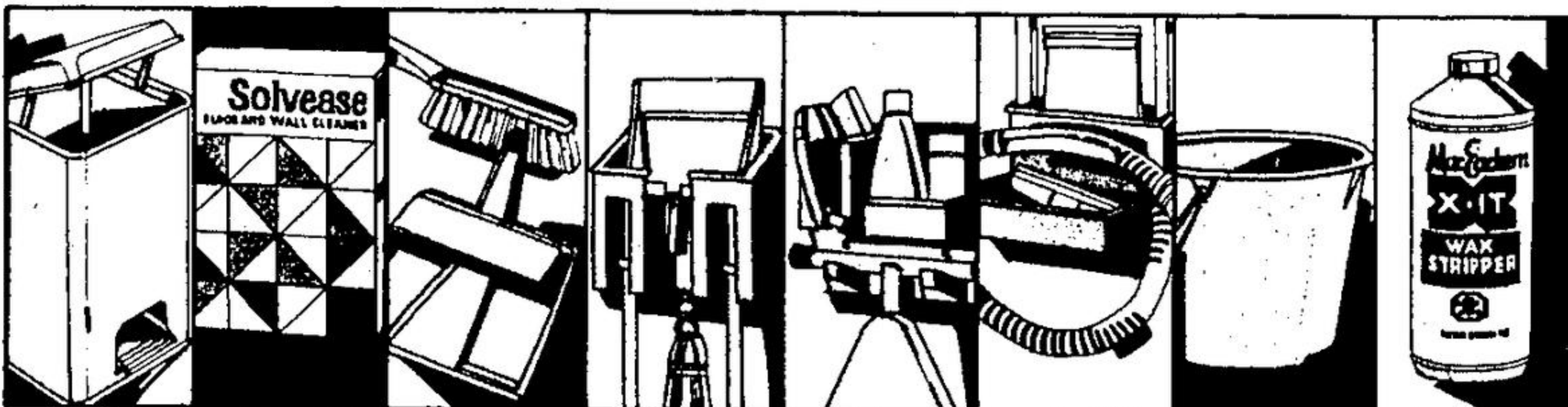

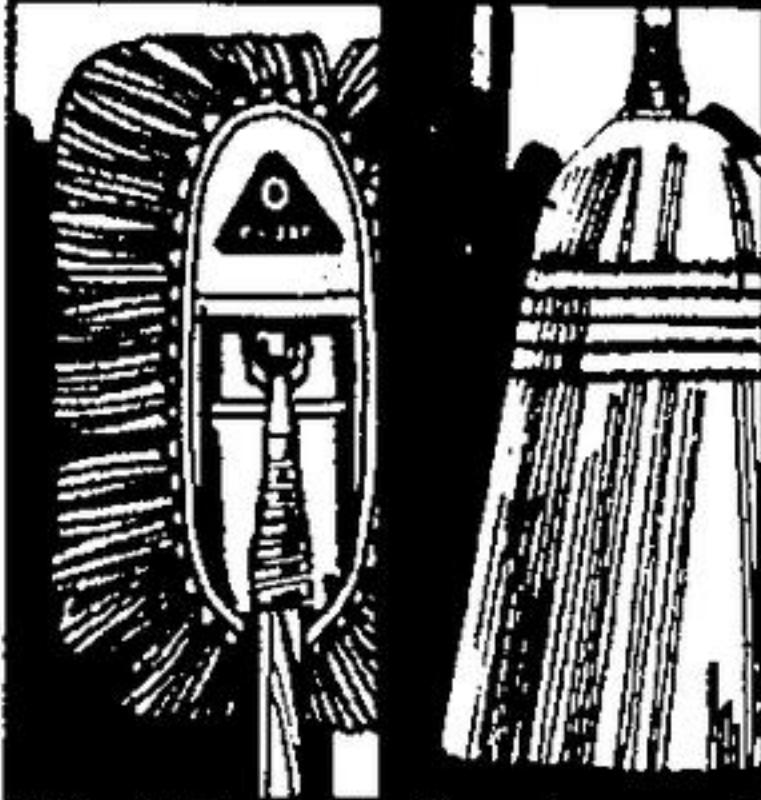
