Entrants will arrive between 5:00 and 7:00 p.m. this Friday and will take part in the Friday night hootenanny in the cafeteria. Solo, duet and group competitions begin in earnest 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning running through to 4:30 in the afternoon. Finalists will be chosen from these preliminaries and they will form the nucleus of the Saturday evening concert which begins at 7:00 p.m. These finalists will be competing for over \$1000.00 in cash prizes.

In addition such groups as Captain Marvel's Zamb Band from Preston and the Madawaska Valley Singers, competing in the festival, there will be several other featured performances by a local bluegrass group led by Roger Frost and last year's group winners, Sage. There will be a special bluegrass workshop for interested musicians commencing at 2:00 p.m. Saturday. Gord Fendley and Ron Fiddler will emcee the Saturday night concert.
