

Five Georgetown Bowlers Tops In Bantam Tourney

Last week a team of five Georgetown boys between the ages of nine and 12 were crowned champions at the 14th Annual World Bantam Bowling Championships. They bowled a two-game total of 2023, the second highest score ever to date, by 23 pins, a team from Queensway Bowl, Toronto, which had earlier won the Southern Ontario Provincial Championship.

More than 150 teams travelled to the Sportsman's Bowl in Guelph to compete in the event. The Georgetown teams bowled in the last of five shifts.

Our boys team was led by Kevin Harrison's 486 double, which earned him the third high boys double award. Alan Bodin (433), David Finlay (431), Russell Gourlie (360) and Grant Richardson (311) made up the rest of the team coached by Joan Richardson. The boys not only won the huge Manhattan trophy, but each received an individual trophy.

The team went out in front after the first game scoring 1063 compared to Queensway's 1002. In the final game, Georgetown bowled 960, Queensway managed 994 but it was not enough to win.

The victory topped off an extremely successful year for both the Georgetown bantam boys and Mrs. Richardson, as she had coached a representative team to third place at the provincial championships in London last month.

Our girls team are not to be forgotten either. Under the guidance of coach Joan Archibald, the Georgetown girls rolled a two game score of 1746, to place ninth, out of 76 teams. Lisa Brownlee was our high girl with a 420 double. Other team members were Julie Burns (355), Janet Hicks (347), Nicola Cox (315) and Diane Leonard (309). Their team scores of 875 and 871 showed a good level of consistency.

Congratulations to both teams on their fine efforts and great results!

The girls crown went to a team from St. Catharines. They shot 1943 to finish ahead of the second place team from Oshawa that rolled 1915. Albion Bowl, Rexdale, placed third with 1827.

The boys high double was won by Larry Theodore of Queensway, Toronto with 510. Dale Shutt of Oshawa was second with 500. They were also won the boys high single with his 300 game.

Theresa Volpe of Oshawa captured the girls high double with her 510, and high single of 285. Second in the doubles department was Jane Bocciolelli with 463 followed by Newmarket's Wanda Finlay who had 457. Miss Finlay's 279 single was good for second spot while Lynda Pope of Mimico had the third high single of 270.

Every youngster participating received a pennant, a crest, two 45 rpm records and an assortment of snacks.

This Saturday, April 20, is the day Georgetown's "leading lady" heads off to Ottawa to compete in the National Youth Bowling Championships. Julie Burns will join the other Southern Ontario representatives Saturday morning and will travel to the nation's capital by train.

Julie has been practising hard lately to sharpen up her game, and coaches Joan and George Archibald are extremely pleased with her progress. All her efforts will hopefully come together in Ottawa when Julie competes for the gold medal in the bantam girls singles event.

The national champion will be decided on the number of games won or tied after round robin matches with all competitors.

Supporting Julie in Ottawa will be her coaches, parents and a few of her friends.

All Georgetown is hoping for you Julie and we wish you the best of luck as we know you will represent Georgetown and Southern Ontario well.

Tri-County Hockey Draws To A Close For Another Season

All of Georgetown's representative teams which competed in the Tri-County Hockey League have now finished for the season. All are welcome to attend this meeting. A summary of the teams' activities during the season is as follows:

NOVICES: (eight years old)
This team did not have the same schedule as the other ten teams, but have been playing, for the first year, in a regular league schedule. This coming weekend they are scheduled to play in their final tournament of the season at Orillia.

MINOR ATOMS: (nine years old)
The minor atoms were eliminated in the ONHA qualifying round by Chinguacousy and have since won the Tri-County Minor Atom title, defeating Milton. They competed in the Silver Stick Tournament at Chinguacousy during the Christmas holidays, and also in the Timmy Tyke Tournament in Toronto in which they were "D" series finalists.

The Tri-County Major Bantam playoffs were a duplication of this with Georgetown defeating Dundas and Chinguacousy defeating Georgetown. Georgetown major bantams competed in the annual bantam tournament during the March break.

MINOR MIDGETS: (15 years old)
The minor midgets lost out in the OMHA qualifying round to Chinguacousy and later lost the Tri-County Minor Midget title, while losing to Streetsville. The minor midgets competed in the Silver Stick Tournament in Chinguacousy at Christmas and were handicapped by being classified as a major team

which minimized their chances. **MAJOR MIDGETS:** (16 years old)
