## BEAVER No. 26 handyman tips

### Installing wooden fence posts:

1. We recommend that you use 4" x 4" Cedar fence posts.
2. The post should be treated with Creosote wood preservative up to 8" above ground level.

3. Use a post hole digger to dig a 2'-3" hole for 4" (above ground) posts or a 3' hole for 6" (above ground) posts.
4. Place Creosote-treated post in hole and fill with Sakrete pre-mixed concrete.
5. Brace the post with twine and ground stakes until set.
6. Your posts are now ready to accept your new fence.

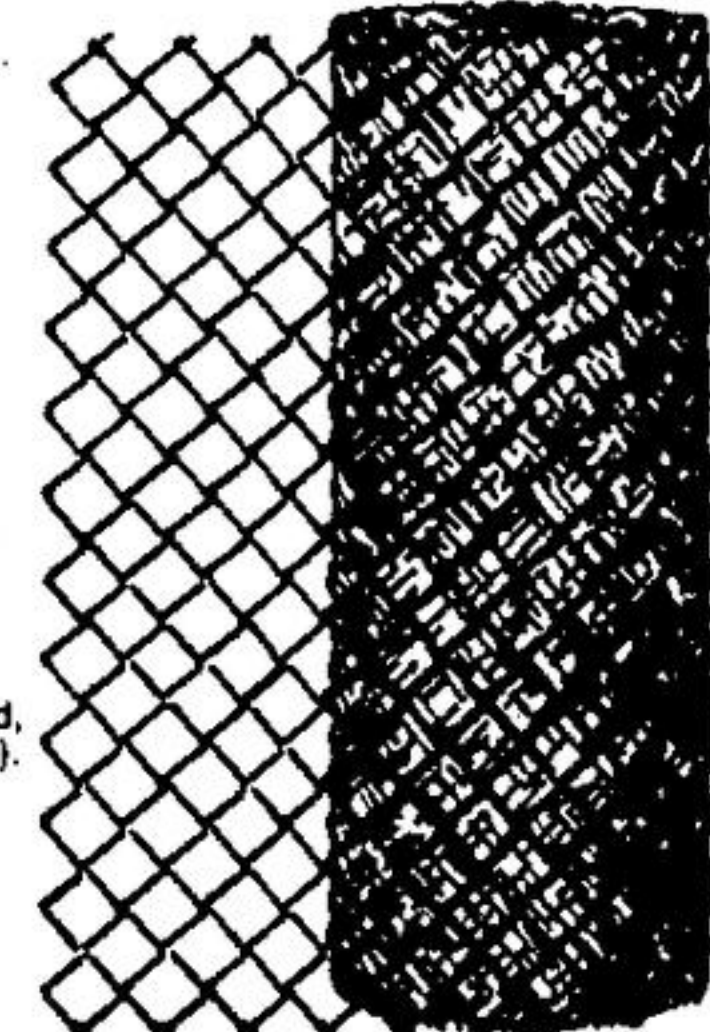
