General Hospital and a pediatrician believed that an intravenous hook-up may have helped the young girl. However, he did not fault the doctors involved.
"It's very easy to look back and be wise," he noted. "There is indication that an I.V. drip was needed but Dr. Ashenhurst considered the discomfort of the child over how much benefit he felt it would do, which is good."
"I feel that the child did require intravenous therapy," he added. "As an emergency route for the diagnosis, she was in a critical situation."
Dr. Azzopardi found fault with the drug "Tedral" which was prescribed by Dr. Alexander Ashenhurst, the family physician, to stop the wheezing in the baby. Dr. Azzopardi believed the combination of ephedrine, theophylline and phenobarbital in the drug was not good for the child, especially when graval was added.
"I would have stopped administering the ophyllyne to the baby immediately if vomiting occurred," he explained. "The ophyllyne is a potentially dangerous drug. The margin of safety above the dosage recommended for children is very small."
He told the court that the dangers of the drug were pointed out in 1959 when it was noted that the drug in suppository form can be lethal in children. He added that more recent books, published this year, did not recommend the drug to children under five years old and that if given, it should be administered by weight and not age.
With Graval, the doctor noted it is not intended for children under the age of eight years old in the texts published this year. He added that "large dosages can be dangerous."
"It depresses the central nervous system and has caused convulsions," he said.
While Dr. Azzopardi did not blame any one person, because the drugs were used by numerous physicians who do not know of their dangers, he felt that perhaps Dr. Ashenhurst could have consulted another physician about the girl's condition.
He explained that if he were consulted he would have performed tests and probably started intravenous feedings based on the results.
"I would try to correct the imbalance of electrolyte by giving proper fluids," he added. "Also, I would give cortisone to
