## Solar Energy Heat Of Future

Can we harness solar energy to heat homes soon? Many scientists don't think so. But some have already done it. Scientists are building sunabsorbing devices to heat their homes. They say people living in sunny areas can build their own solar home heaters in half

a day for \$100. The setup works like a forced hot air heating system. Air is forced out of the house with a fan into a huge bag on the ground or roof outside - then back inside. Rays of the sun permeate the walls of the bag. and the air inside can zoom up to 90 degrees hotter than the outside temperature. As long as

the sun shines. Other ingenious ways to capture the sun's heat are being explored. Solar farms in the Southwest desert - thousands of acres covered with sunabsorbing surfaces -- are now being suggested as possible heating sources to help make steam for power plants. Also under consideration are solar atations that would orbit the earth, converting the sun's rays to electrical energy and sending it back to earth by

And angles at which buildings are erected can help prevent -- or aid -- penetration

from the sun. Solar energy is not expected to be a substitute for fossil - or nuclear-fueled power plants in the near future. But it's certain that more efforts will be made to tap the sun's energy.
