At a general meeting held in Acton, President Gary DeBruyn noted that ice rates are up this year from \$8.50 to \$10.50 per hour, in an attempt w by the Halton Hills recreation department to equalize the town's rates at the two arenas in Acton and Georgetown,

"We were doing fine until regional government took over, said Mr. DeBruyn. "We were self-sufficient but now we're in Georgetown's backyard and we have to raise our rates to their presentation. rates."

Last month, Recreation Director, Doug Collison asked the town's general administration committee how he should handle the problem of two rates at the arenas. He pointed out that ice time costs \$12. per hour in Acton, yet the arena was operating with a \$41,000. loss this year.

The figure skating club members added that the registration rates for children will have to be raised this year to meet the increased expenses

Region Out Of Funds

MacArthur told regional treasurer Don Farmer that the town of Milton may not pay its interim tax levy this week because they do not have the

During a discussion about office furniture for the regional department Mayor MacArthur pointed out that "undue hardships are forced on the area

"We were able to meet the last interim levy, but we won't be able to meet the next one," she told Mr. Farmer. "The area municipalities are lucky to be able to afford a new deak right

Mayor MacArthur was upset over the request by Garfield Brown, the clerk administrator, for two new desks to match two others in the reception area. "I know in Milton, we're not worried about everything matching," she

Mr. Brown told the committee that the request could be deleted from the budget at the present time if they did not mind the mismatched furniture brought from the county of-

Coun. G.W. McKenzie, Halton Hills, added that "we're worse off than Milton right now." He did not believe that the town would meet the interim levy

without borrowing the money. Chairman of the committee, Coun. Ric Morrow pointed out tha the money collected by the region was "used as effectively as possible." "We're still borrowing money because we haven't set a mill rate and collected taxes," he told the other councillors.

Tax Levy May Suffer

Mr. Farmer added that the region was not very well off and as Coun. Morrow pointed out wasstill "borrowing money." "Part of the first interim levy was used for capital works projects," he said.

The regional concillors approved the request by the department head for \$43,600 worth of new office equipment including typewriters, desks and an executive suite for the treasury department, but added the equipment could not be ordered until after the budget was set.
