#### Handicapped Is Studied

She's working her way through college, and part of that work is being accomplished in Halton Hills Cheryl Soderlund, 21, a fourth-year student at the University of Ottawa who is working her way towards a bachelor of science degree in therapeutic recreation, will spend the summer in Halton

Hills, studying recreation

services and needs for the

handicapped.
Cheryl is working out of the department of recreation offices at Cedarvale Community Centre in Georgetown, where services she requires are being provided by recreation director Doug Collison and his staff. Mr. Collison acquired the services of Miss Soderlund following

enquiries made by the provincial ministry of community and social services. The ministry asked municipal recreation departments if they could make use of such a survey into recreation needs for the handicapped. Halton Hills replied, one of very few in the province to do so. Miss Soderlund, who is from

Wawa, is employed by the sports and recreation bureau of the ministry, with whom she files weekly reports on her work. She will prepare a comprehensive report after her summer here, in which she will detail what services are offered, what services are needed, and how they might be applied for the handicapped. She also plans to make recommendations where she believes recommendations are


recreation needs of the handicapped will encompass the lame and the retarded and the perceptually handicapped.


