Music Show Is Big Hit

Tommy Scott's Country Music Circus Stage and Wild West Show burst into the Georgetown Arena last Thursday night with all the fanfare of "big top" production. Stars of radio, records and television, country music, clowns, novelty acts, magic, sharp shooting and Indian dancing filled an action packed evening to the delight of 525 youngsters.

The show included the singing songs such as Yellow Ribbon Round The Old Oak Tree, Let Me Be There and Ramblin' Man led by Terry Rogers, Stompin' Ed and Big Mama Barb. Hilbilly Sam adeptly spun six pie plates simultaneously on seven foot rods and then as Professor "Bo Jo" balanced himself precariously atop a ten foot pole.

A fire eating Indian, the Masked Rider and the great Nausini's arrows through the head box trick amazed the young patrons. The children who moved down onto the floor felt a closer rapport with the performers as they spun through their mad-cap country antics with refreshing zest. The Wild West Show performs in about 320 towns each year and is certain to return again to Georgetown.

Handicapped Recreation Is Studied

She's working her way through college, and part of that work is being accomplished in Halton Hills. Cheryl Soderlund, 21, a fourth-year student at the University of Ottawa who is working her way towards a bachelor of science degree in therapeutic recreation, will spend the summer in Halton Hills, studying recreation services and needs for the handicapped.

Cheryl is working out of the department of recreation offices at Cedarvale Community Centre in Georgetown, where services she requires are being provided by recreation director Doug Collison and his staff. Mr. Collison acquired the services of Miss Soderlund following enquiries made by the provincial ministry of community and social services. The ministry asked municipal recreation departments if they could make use of such a survey into recreation needs for the handicapped. Halton Hills replied, one of very few in the province to do so.

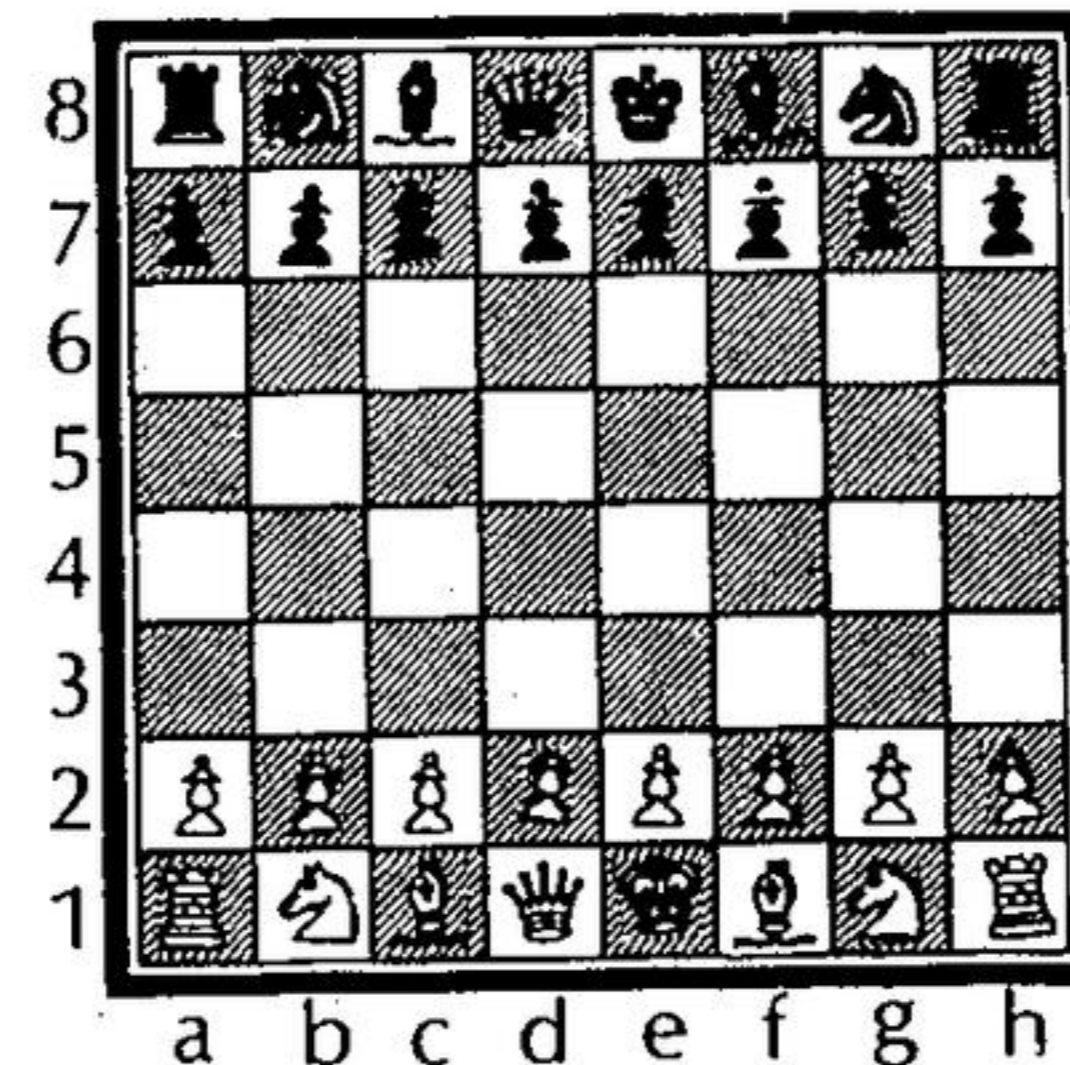
Miss Soderlund, who is from Wawa, is employed by the sports and recreation bureau of the ministry, with whom she files weekly reports on her work. She will prepare a comprehensive report after her summer here, in which she will detail what services are offered, what services are needed, and how they might be applied for the handicapped. She also plans to make recommendations where she believes recommendations are needed.

"I want to find out what organizations there are assisting the handicapped," she explained, "and what programs are offered." She will also seek to determine what facilities could be used to meet a need, if a need is found to exist. Cheryl says she is interested in community work with special populations, and she has been spending her summers earning college finances with that goal in mind. Her aim is to get into leisure counselling, a relatively new field in the realm of recreation. She has worked with the YM-YWCA in Ottawa and has co-ordinated programs for the physically handicapped. She finds it worthwhile to work with the handicapped.

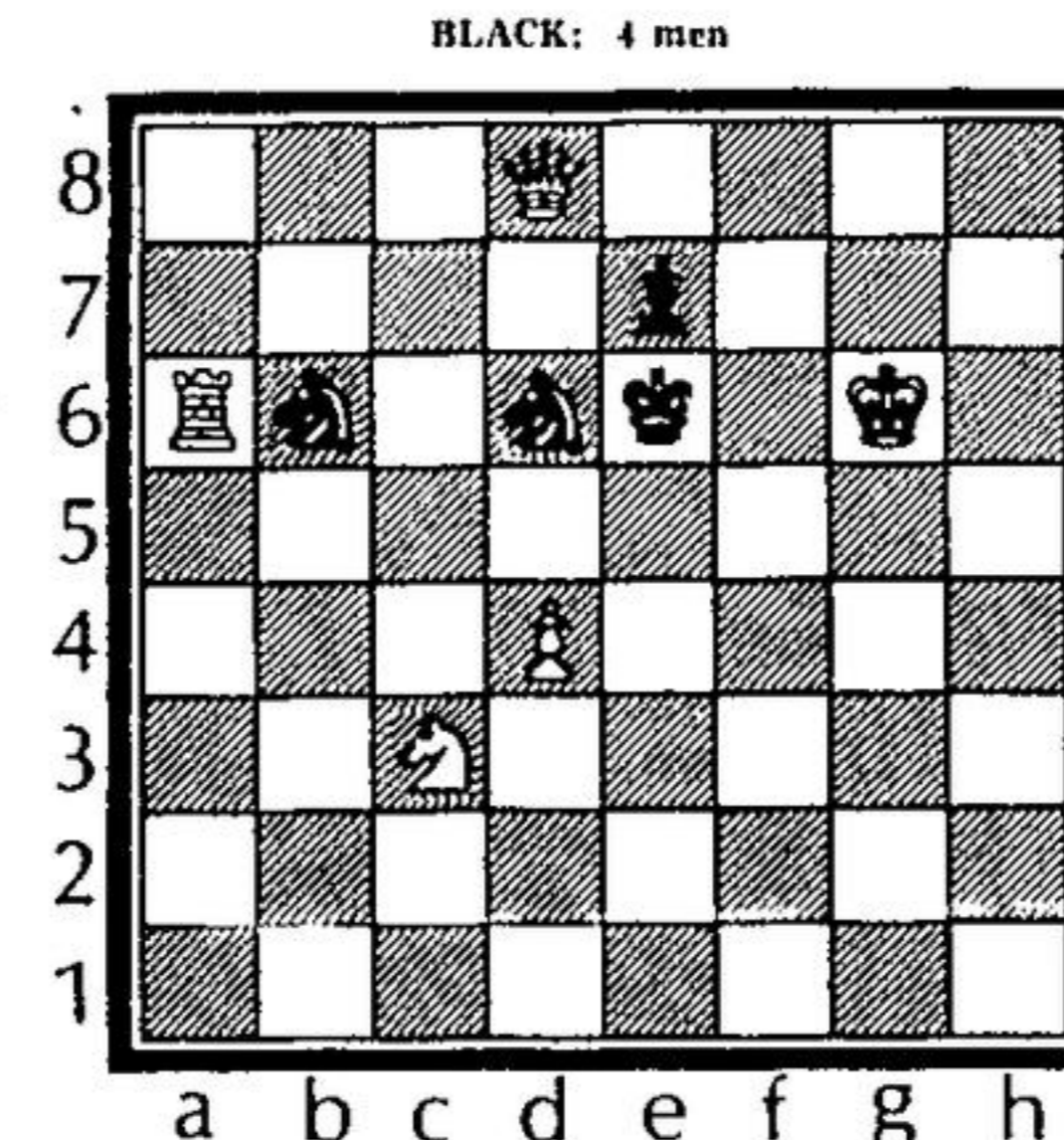
For the benefit of those readers who missed the first article, we will re-explain the notation which we use. All our articles are written in algebraic notation. The squares of the board are numbered as in the diagram.



If a pawn were moved to white's Queen's side Bishop file, fourth square, the move would be recorded; cc. If on the following move, the same pawn captured a black pawn on the Queen's file the move would be recorded; cd. In opposition, a Bishop move may be recorded; Bc4; while a rook capture may be recorded; Rxd1.

If, for example, both rooks are able to move to the same square, the move might be recorded; Ra1d1, meaning the rook on square a1 is moved to square d1.
