### Twin Cee Co. Baltimore Air Coil

Twin-Cee is the sort of company that never makes much fuss about what they do, they just get on with it and do a good job.

What they make are those things that most people take for granted unless they're not around, waste paper receptacles, ashtrays and paper-towel dispensers.

Twin-Cee Limited Metal Fabricators are on 20 Armstrong Road, Georgetown. The original plant and office space was quite small, but recently they expanded and doubled their original space.

The federal department of supply and services announced Monday that a \$12,713 contract has been awarded to Twin-Cee for the manufacture of waste receptacles during the twelve month period ending April 16, 1975.

It was one of 198 unclassified contracts, each worth \$10,000 or more, for a total value of \$12,989,344, awarded to Canadian firms during the week ending April 26.

The general manager of Twin-Cee is Russel MacPherson, who has been the manager for five of the ten years Twin-Cee has been in Georgetown. Twin-Cee is owned by G.H. Wood Company Limited, a Toronto based all Canadian firm.

Twin-Cee employs a total of 64 people, the majority coming from Georgetown. Like many other companies, Twin-Cee has found it hard to find local employees.

Mr. MacPherson commented that "the problem with Georgetown is that there is simply too much work to go around. With the expansion in Brampton and Malton, people are leaving town to find work. There's really no reason why anyone in Georgetown should be unemployed."

Nevertheless, last year's production was up by 20 to 30 percent, and in the last four years the volume of production has tripled. The number of employees has also tripled in the last five years.

Mr. MacPherson, who lives in Galt, further commented that "Georgetown is really a very expensive place to live. The price of houses here is far more than in Galt, and although I would like to live here in Georgetown, it's not very practical."

Acton's Station Hotel is getting back on the tracks. In its first major renovation since 1912, Nick and Eli Kekic are completely remodelling the late 19th century structure on Mill St. both inside and outside. The two brothers, who bought the business a little over a year ago, have tried to retain some of the early Canadian atmosphere restoring beams and natural woodwork.

The upstairs rooms are also undergoing a facelift. The kitchens have been entirely modernized. Noonday meals are served daily to Acton businessmen till 2 p.m. In a couple of weeks the brothers hope to extend the hours to include supper.

### Mino Millwork

At first glance the front offices of Mino Millwork on Mountainview North give a deceptive impression of smallness, until one enters the rear warehouse—a vast, cavernous room of neatly stored lumber, frames and finished products.

It is here that owner, Wilf Mino directs a four-man operation that builds sashes, door frames, stairs and cabinets.

Everything is custom made to order, with no assembly line techniques. Work is contracted from schools, industrial and architectural companies.

Buzzing saws, tapping hammers and diligent and proud craftsmanship has earned for Mino Millwork a respected reputation.

### Ferro Steel

Ferro Structural Steel on Armstrong Avenue is planning a mammoth three stage expansion because the present 24,000 square foot operation area has become inadequate.

A large gantry and overhead crane will soon be constructed with storage and fabrication facilities to follow.

"We purchase our structural steel from Algoma, Lasco or Burlington Steel or from anywhere else we can get it," stated vice president Julius Salamon.

The structural steel is stored in their yards until a contract is received at which time drafting and designing drawings are prepared for consultants and architects. The steel then goes to shop for fabrication.

Hundreds of different sizes of steel are cut, welded and connected so that the girders can be assembled on the construction site.

Ferro Steel has made a name for itself as structural steel fabricators, erectors and industrial building designers. Seventy per cent of their jobs are in Metro Toronto although work is done all over Ontario from Sault Ste. Marie to Kingston.

The steel shortage has been irritating but business is thriving.

### Ryder's TV

Earl Ryder, owner of Ryder's T.V. on Main Street, opened his retail store six years ago after moving from Glen Williams.

He sells a complete line of items in the domestic entertainment field from record needles to adapters to digital clocks and offers a wide selection of televisions, stereos, radios and tape recorders.


A service department of three technicians makes repairs and gives top priority to the store brands. Almost any related accessory is available to customers.




