Leave Animals In The Woods

While in the Muskokas recently, I met a man who takes lake trout consistently from Mary lake. Mr. Casselman lives in Chatsworth, and has a cottage on the lake, and only fishes when there is an east wind. In 1972, Mr. Casselman caught a total of 90 pounds of lake trout and in 1973 he caught 42 on Father's Day and a total for the year of 70 pounds. The one in the photo is his largest, at 22 pounds.

The ministry of natural resources has been stocking Mary lake with two year old lakers. Maybe you should try this fishing, and by the way, Mr. Casselman uses only Williams Wobblers.

Wayne Sheppard of Terra Cotta and Dale McGugan of Brampton gave me a photo recently of the walleyes they took in the Severn river. Using black jigs, and fishing at night, they each took their limits of fair-sized fish. The biggest was nine and a half pounds.

LOVED TO DEATH

A twin moose calf born in North Bay district at the end of May was literally loved to death. People who discovered the calf and its twin patted, hugged and snapped photos of them. All this attention probably forced the mother to abandon them and seek shelter in the deep woods.

Conservation officer Bob Wells was called to the scene but his expert care didn't help. One twin died and the other was given to the new Toronto Zoo.

People don't realize that young animals found in the woods should not be touched or approached too closely. The majority are neither abandoned nor orphaned. They are usually left for short intervals while the mother is feeding. Learn to leave wild young alone, even if they are abandoned, nature will take care of its own.

CONSERVATION OFFICER

What is a conservation officer made of He, of all men in the bush, is the most needed and the most unwanted. He is a guidepost to hunting, fishing and outdoor recreation...but a damper to its "full" enjoyment. A nameless creature who is officer to his face and fish cop to his back. If his uniform is neat and clean he is lazy and never gets out of his truck...but if he explores the bush, he goofs off on a paid vacation.

He must know of hunting and fishing...but he must never participate because of unfair advantage his knowledge affords. If he gives advice on how to fish or hunt he is a know-it-all...if he says little, he is saving all the fish and game for himself.

He must know all the fish and game laws and advise you of their existance. If he does this, he is flouting his authority, but if he does not he is setting you up for a pinch. He is, admittedly, necessary. With him rests the responsibility for the continued survival of our fish and game. He must have the discretion to warn, the power to charge and the knowledge of a supreme court judge to know which to do but only with other people.

He must never be told of fish and game abuses. He must in stinctively know the when, and where of violation. If he apprehends offenders he is lucky...but if through public apathy offenders escape, he is a dunce.

He must operate alone and at night. He must never show fear. If you can hit him, he is a coward...but if he hits you he is a brutal bully. He must examine endless numbers of armed hunters...but if he carries his own weapon his a chicken.

A conservation officer is a composite of what all men are. A mingling of dust and diety. A conservation officer must be a guide, and a diplomat, a protection of animals and a gentleman. And of course he must be a genius, for he will have to survive and feed a family on a conservation officers salary.

Credit Valley Conservation Authority has issued it a permit for digging in the river bed. The authority has an inspector going to the site twice each day to make sure that certain rules are adhered to.

The inspector, Bill Hamilton, told me that the construction company must restore the river bed to its original and natural state. This type of thing is unfortunate, but is put down to progress.

Our recent trip to Nakina taught us gulte a bit. One thing is to have a first aid kit on hand. Fortunately, we did not need one, but up there you are on your own, completely.

The assurance of a good first aid kit was a comforting feeling.

Make sure this fits the need of the occasion, and is checked out before you leave. This applies to all phases of outdoor activities.
