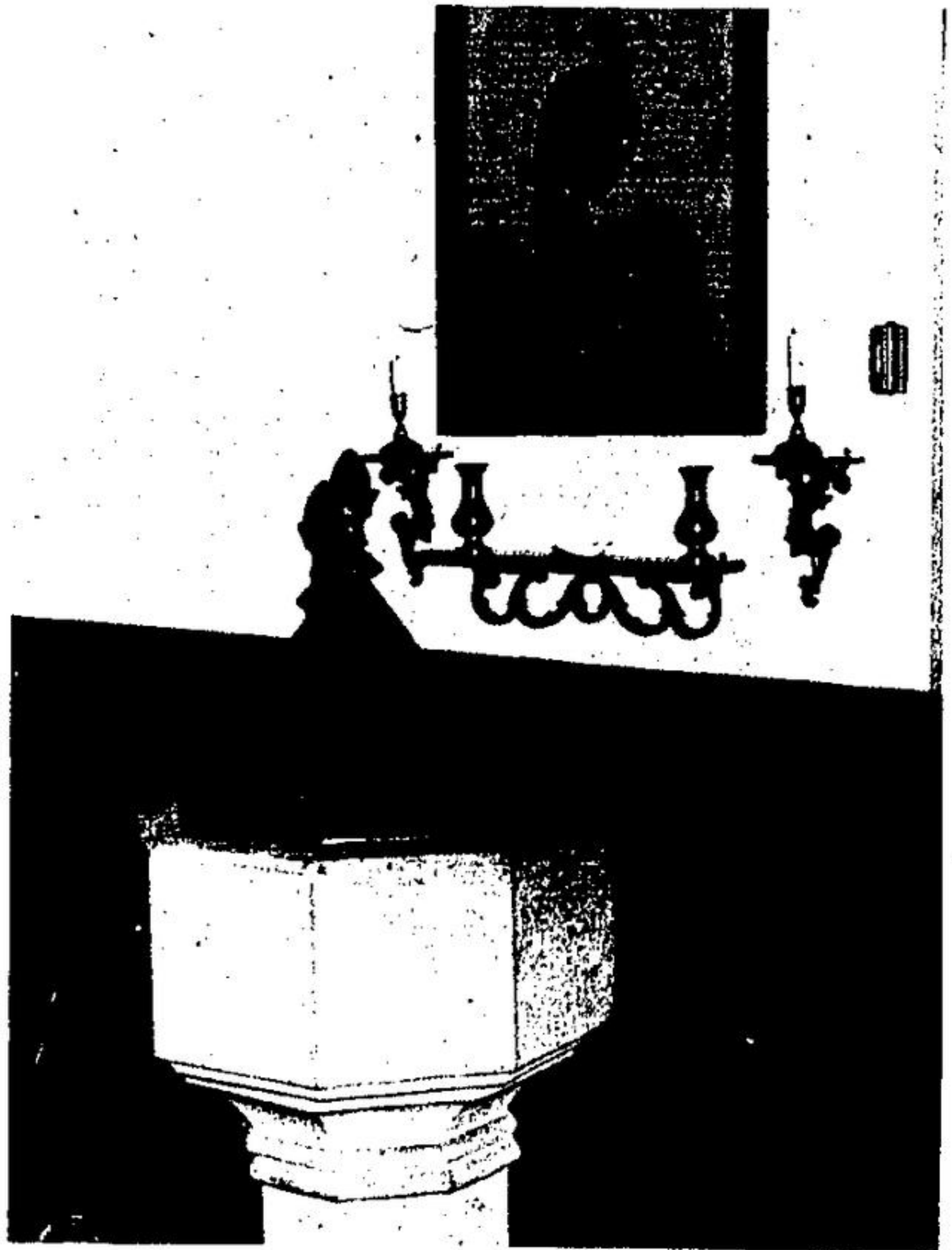

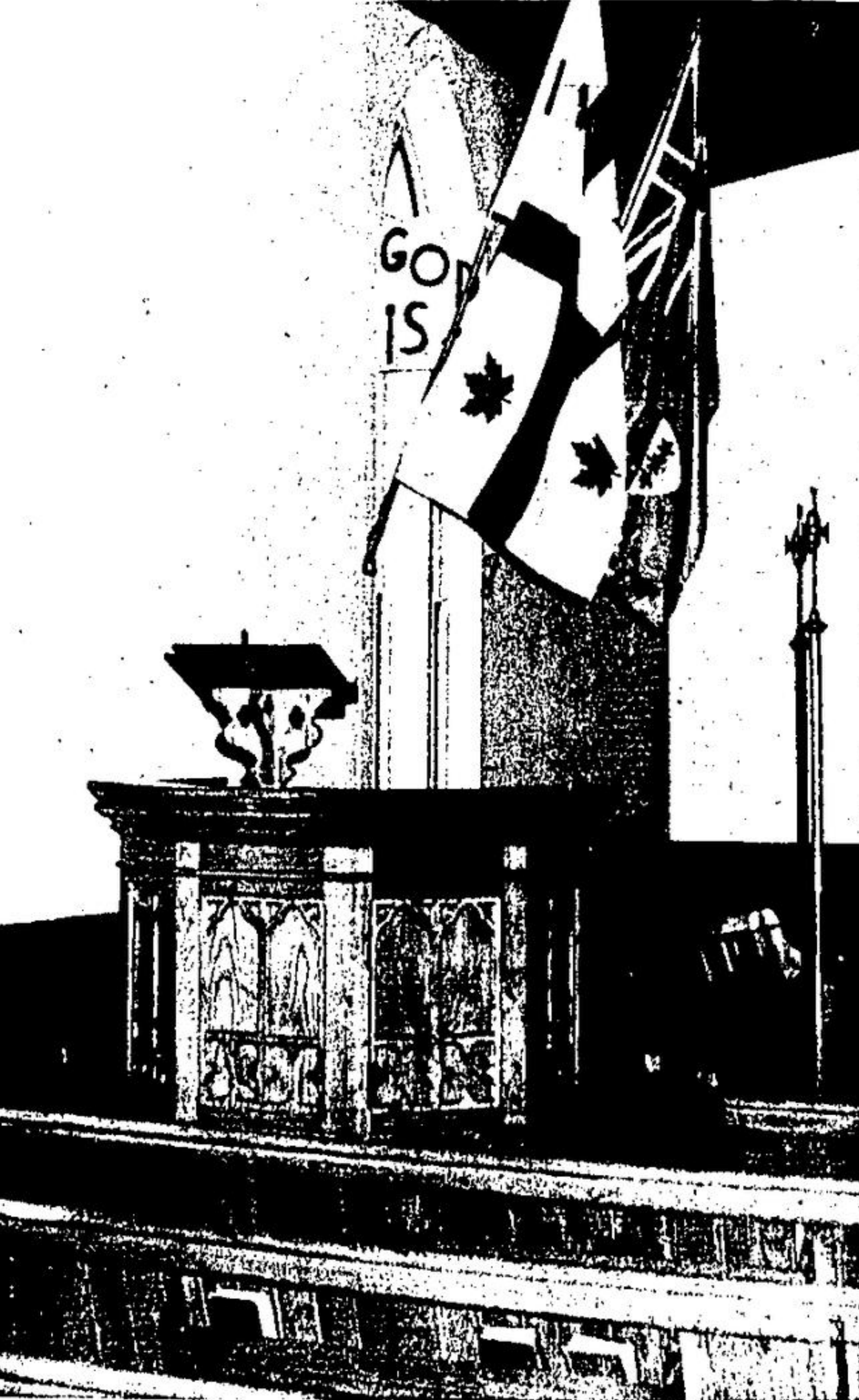

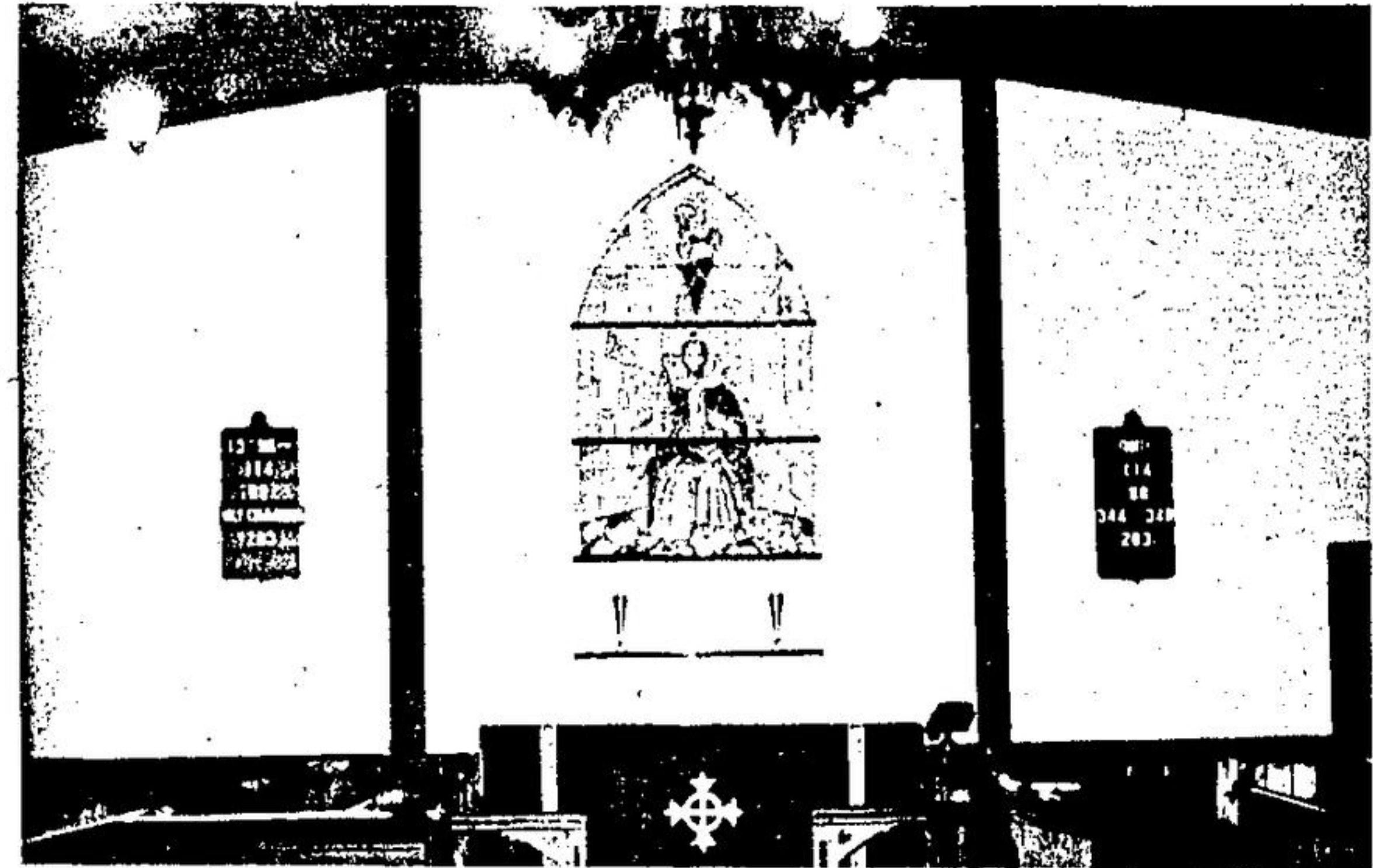

## CHURCHES OF HALTON HILLS

# Huge Three-Decker Pulpit Is Gone From Old Halton Church Building

Although St. Paul's is one of the oldest church buildings in Halton Hills, having been built in 1845, it has changed over the years. Originally it had a huge three-decker pulpit: the service would be read from the lowest level, the scriptures read from the middle one and the sermon preached from the top level. At the back of the church there was a balcony which held "the instrument"—probably an organ, but perhaps a piano—and choir. But in a fit of "improvement" about 1871, the organ and choir were brought downstairs, and the big pulpit removed.

The Presbyterian church at Niagara-on-the-Lake has one of the few remaining three-deckers in Ontario. The present altar and pulpit were obtained from Guelph about a decade ago, when a parish there moved to a new location.


Although the art of producing stained glass is unfortunately being lost, the parish was lucky to be able to draw on the skill of someone who has designed windows for churches throughout the country, Miss Marjorie Nazer, to plan the window depicting Christ, which now looks over the altar.

From time to time great debates have taken place within the Anglican church

over the use of symbolism. Certain types of symbol have been associated with "high" or "low" churchmanship. When one member of the St. Paul's congregation presented the parish with a mother of pearl crucifix, it caused a stir that the church was becoming too "Roman". Another member promptly went to his workshop and fashioned another cross—a plain wooden one without the figure of Christ. The two crosses hung in opposition to one another on opposite sides of the church, and were there when Harold Llewellyn arrived as rector. He preached a sermon on the meaning of the different types of crosses—the crucifix reminding us of Jesus' suffering and the empty cross affirming his resurrection—and placed the two crosses on the wall by the pulpit. There they have remained.

The heavy stone font, dating from 1882, stands by the door of the church as a reminder that a person enters the church by baptism.
