ADDING a festive touch to the bright red front door of 8 Edith Street is Bob Thompson, father of four.



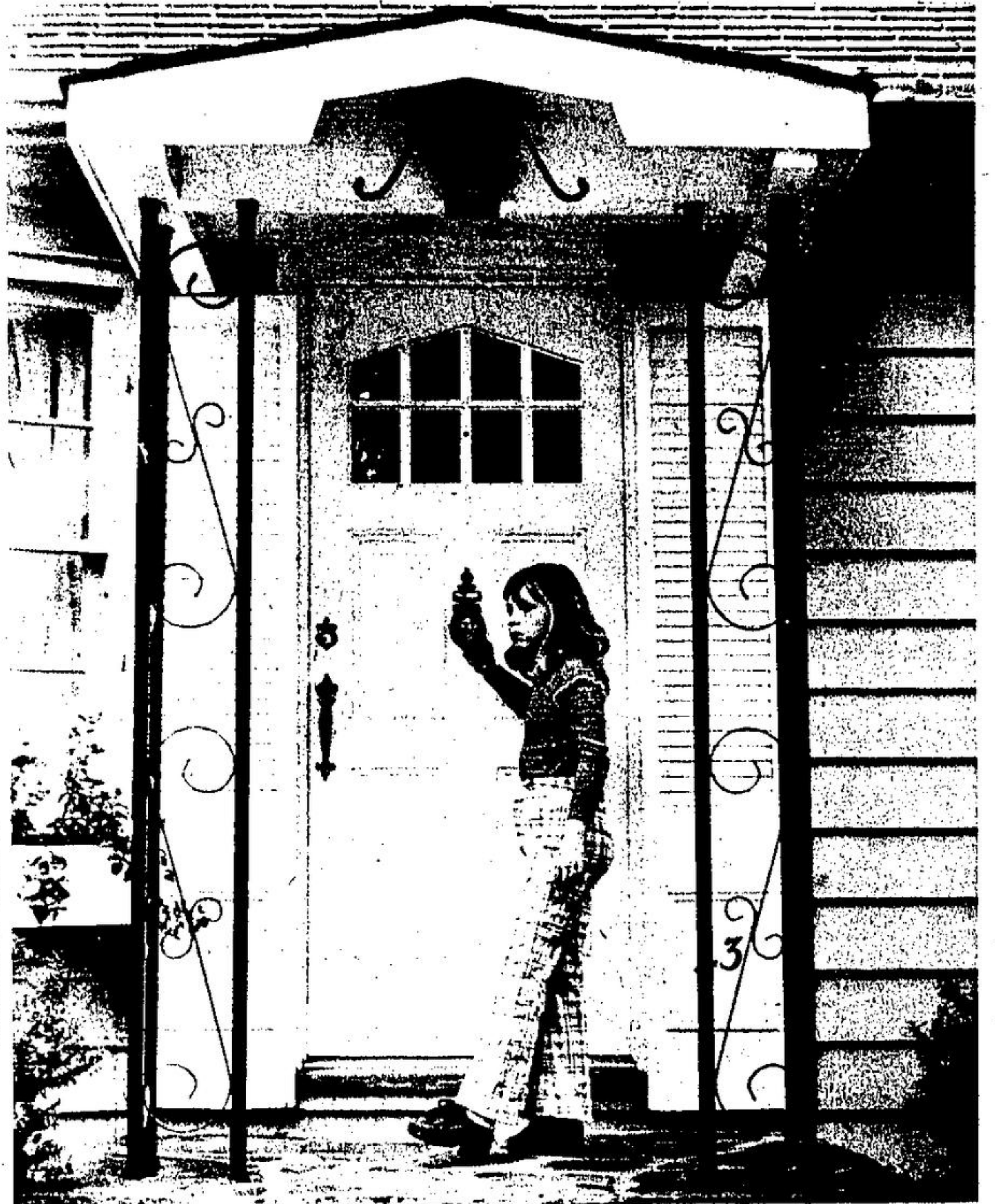
## GGD's and knockers
