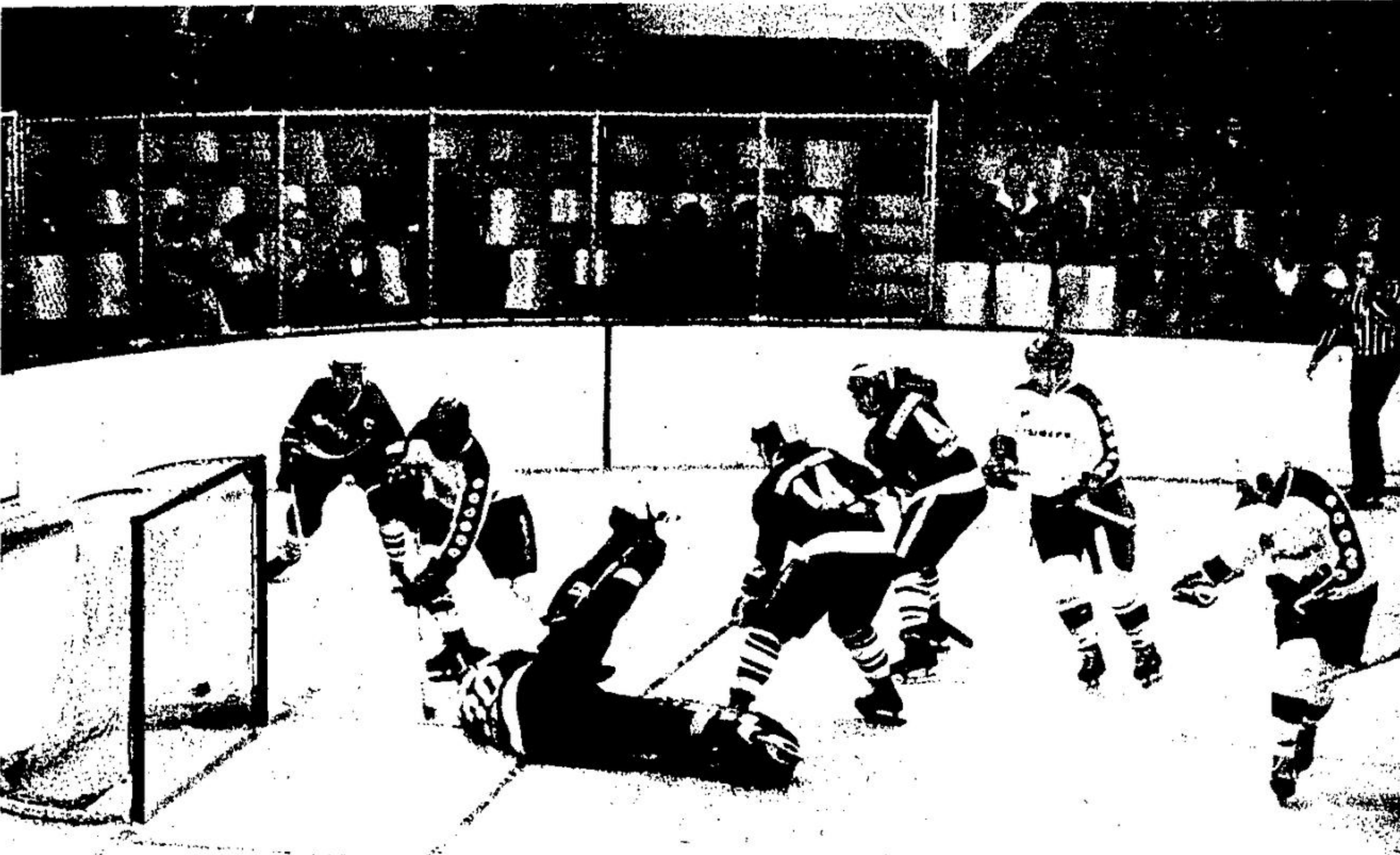

4-town wrap-up

An explanation of "4-town" teams

Raiders suffering from a hangover?

Mike Tarp's Georgetown Chrysler, playing like a minor hockey house league team, slumped 7-1 to the Dundas Merchants at home Sunday night.

Sunday's game was the second in three nights for the Raiders. On Friday night they beat the Oakville Adanacs 5-2 at home.

However, on Sunday, Georgetown seemed to be suffering from a hangover. Before a disappointing crowd of less than 500, they were unable to put together any sort of offense, and their defence was far too slow for the Dundas sharpshooters.

Weak defense was to blame for six of the Merchants' seven goals. Goaltie John Blair, replacing regular Bob McArdie, was solely responsible for the last goal, a hopeful slap shot from the blue line by Ernie Bodden that Blair hopelessly misjudged. It was the final insult in a game the Raiders will want to forget.

Bob Marchildon was absent from the line-up, taking time off

to go hunting, and Gerry Pearson, who is leading the Raiders' scoring this season, seemed to be daydreaming. Only Ray Evans played consistently, scoring a consolation goal at 18:08 in the third. Ray was the only Raider to give one hundred percent effort, while Tom Gilbert occasionally showed flashes of speed down the right wing.

The Merchants were in control of the game right from the start. Although they were outshot in every period by the Raiders, they show far more hustle and determination. Too often, Neil Cotton and John Boyce allowed themselves to be pushed off the puck.

The Merchants' first goal, at 7:24 of the first, was a little on the lucky side; Larry Wilson directing the puck during a goal mouth scramble. However their second, a solo effort by Joe Donald should have been checked. The Raiders allowed him to skate through their defense before anyone realized what was happening, and he easily rounded Blair.

In the second period, the Raiders showed even less imagination. The defense was again to blame for a goal only

ten seconds from the start; Murray James collecting a pass from Desi Deroucher that should have been intercepted. James made no mistake in putting the Merchants three ahead.

As the Raiders tried to apply some sort of pressure on Gerry Aussem, the Merchants goalie, they exposed themselves to quick Dundas breakaways. Bob Larmand collected a two minute penalty for holding, and while the Raiders played one man short, the Merchants scored their best goal of the evening. Bill Nunn cleared the puck from the Dundas blue line to Ernie Bodden who caught the Raiders flat-footed and passed to Joe Donald who was clear in front of the net. John Blair had no chance with Donald's shot.

In the third period, the Raiders showed a little more bite, and seemed to be making some impression on the Merchants' defense. However they gave away a stupid penalty at 13:32. A player deliberately threw his stick to block a harmless shot, and Bodden had little trouble with the penalty shot.

From then on the Raiders never looked likely to even score and at 14:15 the Merchants again took advantage of the Raiders' defense. Larry Wilson connecting on a good pass from Rick Ryckman. The Merchants finished scoring with that slap shot at 15:14.

The Raiders now travel to Dunnville Thursday evening, and hopefully, will show a little more bite.

 "What are the 4-Town teams?" That is a question that many parents ask when informed their son has been selected for one of these teams.

A 4-town team is a house league allstar team comprising of the best 14-16 players available in that league. There are four teams, Mac's Milk Atom, Georgetown Chrysler Pee Wees, Montego Construction Bantams and the Midgets.

These allstar teams are formed to represent the GD-MHA at house league tournaments of which the two best known are the 4-Town and Newmarket tournaments. Two of our teams also entered Hanover's last year.

During the regular season play, each team moves up one league and competes for that league's honors and trophies. For example, last year the Bantams played in the midget league where they were league champions and goalie Steve Waldrum won the Vezina trophy. The atoms play in the pee wee division, the pee wees in the bantam, the bantam in the midget and the midgets in the juveniles league. One reason for moving the teams up is to give the players better competition because remember, they are the best in their age group. A positive benefit has been the improvement in the calibre of play noted in all leagues.

The name 4-Towners came out of the original 4-Town Tournament which is exactly what it sounds like. Four towns, Milton, Acton, Orangeville and Georgetown began the house league tournament many years ago and the teams formed to play in those games were tagged 4-towners.
